# ROBERT TYRE JONES, JR.

Who was reared in and played from Atlanta, Georgia, and who in the space of fifteen years, from 1916 through 1930, played in thirty-one major championships of the United States and Great Britain, and retired at the age of 28 with this list of victories:

UNITED STATES AMATEUR, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1928, 1930.

United States Open, 1923, 1926, 1929, 1930. British Open, 1926, 1927, 1930. British Amateur, 1930.

Additionally, he won the first Georgia State Amateur Championship in 1916 at the age of 14; won the Southern Amateur Championship in 1917, 1920, and 1922; and played as a member of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1922, 1924, 1926, 1928 and 1930, being captain in the last two meetings, and never last a particle of singles.

losing a match at singles.

At his retirement from competitive Golf in 1930 his status as First Official World Champion was assured by his winning in that year the British Amateur, the British Open, the United States Open and the United States Amateur Championships, known as the Grand Slam, and thus entrenching his record safely and forever within the Impregnable Quadrilateral of Golf.



Nashville, Tenn. — Slender Hubert Green, of Birmingham, Ala., won his second Southern Golf Association championship by out-firing a fine field in the 63rd annual tournament at the Belle Meade Country Club in Nashville in July. 1969.

Green shot an eight-under-par 280 total for the 72 holes to whip Bob Barbarossa. of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., by five shots. Green was under par in every round

going 71-69-69-71.

His play on the back nine was the difference as he finished that side 13 under par. In playing the two back side par three holes he had seven birdies and one par for an amazing seven under for the eight attempts.

Steve Melnyk, the Western champion, finished third at 286 followed by defending champion Lanny

Wadkins, of Richmond, Va., at 287.

Green went into the final round with a five shot lead and held it nearly all the way on the last 18.

In a playoff during the third round Melnyk's 75 whipped Bob Lowry, Jr., Huntsville, Ala., for the medalist award. The two had tied at 139 over the 36 hole route for the medal.

Melnyk, of Brunswick, Ga., led Georgia to the team title at seven under par for the 36 holes. Joining Melnyk (139), was Jim Gabrielson, Atlanta, at two under, Atlanta's Charlie Harrison one under and James Key. Columbus, one over.

Green had previously won the Southern in 1966 over his home course at the Birmingham Country Club.

The tournament drew 220 of the top amateurs in the 14 states composing the SGA with the entry maximum being reached a full month before the tournament start.

Green had been right behind the leaders through the first 36 holes at Belle Meade, then pulled away with his third round 69. In the final round Hubert wrapped it up when he put together three straight birdies at Nos. 14, 15 and 16 to beat down the final challenge of the other contenders.

Ed Brantly, of Signal Mcuntain, Tenn. won a playoff with John Mahaffey, of Kerrville, Texas, for the first division after both had totaled 299. Lew Conner, of Nashville, won the second division with a 305 total for the 72 holes over the testing Belle Meade layout.

John Townsend, of Houston, Tex., won the championship consolation by defeating Bob Lupton, of Largo, Fla., 1 up.





Kenneth Hamlin won the Robert T. Jones flight and Max Clayton the Sam Perry flight.



# CONSTITUTION

# OF THE

# SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

(1968 Amendment)

# ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be "The Southern Golf Association."

# ARTICLE II

The object of this Association shall be to promote the game of golf, the protection of the interests of its members, the holding of such tournaments as may be decided on by the Board of Directors, and the suitable recognition of the winners in the championship or other contests.

# ARTICLE III

Upon the adoption of this Constitution (1968 Amendment) the Association shall consist of those clubs named on the Roster of Membership hereto attached.

# ARTICLE IV

Membership shall be open to any regularly organized club in any of the states enumerated below and such club shall be admitted on an application which receives the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present in person at the meeting at which such application is considered. A regularly organized club is a permanent club composed of individual dues-paying members who manage their own affairs through officers and committees whom they select. Such club shall operate permanently at one golf

course but need not control the course where it plays. The aforementioned states are:

# ARTICLE V

Applications for membership shall be made in writing to the secretary of this Association, accompanied by such information as that officer deems necessary for the Board of Directors to have before passing on the application. Dues for a full year shall accompany the application.

# ARTICLE VI

Section 1: A member club agrees and is deemed to understand that it, at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors, may be suspended or expelled from the Association with or without cause, provided two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present in person vote to take such action. In the event such action is taken the member club involved shall have no right to any information or particulars relating to the action taken nor shall it have the right to be heard upon the question.

# ARTICLE VII

Section 1: The annual meeting of the Association shall be held during the week and at the place of the Annual Southern Championship Tournament, the exact

day and hour to be fixed by the President of the Association, and the Secretary shall give at least fourteen days' notice thereof to each member.

Section 2: A special meeting of the Association may be held on call of the President or by written request directed to the Secretary and signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, provided at least ten days' written notice thereof is given to each member.

Section 3: At any regular or special meeting of the Association each member shall have the right to be represented, but in person only, by one voting delegate or alternate.

Section 4: At any regular or special meeting of the Association those representatives of members, present in person, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting.

# ARTICLE VIII

Section 1: At the annual meeting the Association shall elect from the member clubs then composing the Association a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Vice President in Charge of Senior Affairs, and a Board of Directors of not less than twenty-five nor more than forty-five members (in addition to the President and Vice Presidents) who shall hold office until the last day of the current year.

Section 2: All officers mentioned in Section 1 of this Article shall also be fully qualified members of the Board of Directors.

Section 3: At any annual meeting the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds vote of those present in person, may elect directors emeritus to serve for life and those so elected shall have seat and voice but no vote.

Section 4: The President shall have the authority to appoint associate directors for terms not to exceed one year and those so appointed shall have seat and voice but no vote.

# ARTICLE IX

The management of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors. They shall each year im-

mediately following the annual meeting of the Association elect a secretary and a treasurer (both of which offices may be combined in one person), fix the bonds and salaries for such offices if there be any, prescribe their duties, and otherwise direct the affairs of the Association and the conduct of its officers.

# ARTICLE X

The Board of Directors shall have the power to select sites for all tournaments sponsored by this Association and to determine the method of play in such tournaments, or to delegate such power or any part thereof to any duly established committee.

# ARTICLE XI

The Board of Directors may establish such standing and other committees as they consider proper or for the best interests of the Association and the membership of all such committees shall consist of those persons appointed by the President. The President shall ex officio be a member of all committees.

# ARTICLE XII

A special meeting of the Board of Directors may be held at any time on call of the President or by written request signed by a majority of the Board of Directors and directed to the Secretary provided at least ten days notice thereof is given to all directors.

# ARTICLE XIII

At any meeting of the Board of Directors at which a site for holding an annual tournament is to be determined votes of absent members of the board on the question of site selection will be received and given the same effect as if such members were present and voting in person.

# ARTICLE XIV

A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business at any annual or special meeting.

# ARTICLE XV

Section 1: The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association or of the Board of Directors, and shall carry out the directions of the Directors in managing the affairs of the Association.

Section 2: (a) The First Vice-President shall, in the absence of the President, perform the duties of that office.

(b) The Second Vice-President shall, in the absence of the First Vice-President, perform the duties of that office.

(c) The Vice-President in charge of Senior affairs shall primarily be responsible for all functions of the Association sponsored for the Seniors.

Section 3: The Secretary shall keep the records of the Association, give notices of all meetings, and perform such other duties as the Directors may require of him.

Section 4: The Treasurer shall collect all moneys belonging to the Association and disburse same under direction of the Board of Directors. He shall report in writing to the Board of Directors and the Association at each meeting of either body.

# ARTICLE XVI

Section 1: Each member shall pay to the Treasurer, by or before the date of the annual meeting, twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars annual dues.

Section 2: The accounting year shall begin January 1 and end December 31, of each year.

Section 3: Failure to pay dues by or before the date of the annual meeting shall preclude the delinquent from representation at any meeting and debar their members from the privileges of entering any Association contest while the said Club is delinquent. If said delinquency continues for sixty days after the end of the fiscal year, the club shall be dropped from membership.

# ARTICLE XVII

Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual or special meeting of the Association by a vote of at least two-thirds of all the votes cast, provided ten days' notice has been given of the proposed amendment.

# BY-LAWS

Section 1. The order of business at all meetings of the Association shall be as follows:

- 1. Roll Call.
- 2. Reading of minutes of previous meetings.
- 3. Secretary's report.
- 4. Treasurer's report.
- 5. General and new business.
- 6. Elections.
- 7. Adjournment.

Section 2. Each year a tournament for the amateur championship of the South shall be held under the direction and management of the Board of Directors, and suitable prizes awarded in the championship and other contests. The entrance fee in such tournaments shall be \$20.00 for each entrant. The entries shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 2-A. At each annual meeting the Board of Directors shall decide definitely upon the place where the next year's championship tournament shall be held.

Section 3. No player shall be eligible to compete for the championship unless he is a bona fide resident of one of the States covered by the Association and a member of a club belonging to the Association and in good standing; except that no entry shall be received from any competitor who shall not have been a member of the club from which he is entered for sixty days prior to the date of the competition unless said competitor shall be otherwise eligible by reason of his membership in some other club.

Section 4. All competitions shall be played strictly in accordance with the rules of golf as approved by the United States Golf Association, with such special rules as the Board of Directors may adopt or authorize. All disputes shall be decided by the Board of Directors, who shall officiate as a tournament committee of this Association, and whose decisions shall be final.

Section 5. All complaints or disputes between club members of this Association shall be decided by those members of the Board of Directors who in no way are connected with the disputes.

Section 6. Any member or person who is proved, to the satisfaction of two-thirds of the Board of Directors, to have been guilty of fraudulent, or discreditable conduct of any kind, may be, by the Board, declared to be ineligible to compete in any competition, suspended or expelled.

Section 7. The Board of Directors shall consist of no more than 45 members, in addition to the President and Vice Presidents.

Section 8. The Board of Directors shall have power, by a two-thirds vote, to alter, amend, or add to the By-Laws (as they may deem necessary), such action of the Board to be subject to review of the Association.

Section 9. A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 10. Upon dissolution no part of the property or assets of said Association shall be distributed to its members, directors or officers, nor shall any amounts be paid to the members, directors or officers thereof for money loaned or advanced to the Association or by way of reimbursement for membership dues or otherwise. Any assets of said Association remaining after payment of all debts of said Association shall be transferred by said Association to any Corporation organized for exempt purposes substantially the same as the purposes of the Association so being dissolved.
