Commemorating his career in Golf and the greatest record yet achieved in the competitive phases of the game, this trophy is dedicated to

ROBERT TYRE JONES, JR.

Who was reared in and played from Atlanta, Georgia, and who in the space of fifteen years, from 1916 through 1930, played in thirty-one major championships of the United States and Great Britain, and retired at the age of 28 with this list of victories:


UNITED STATES AMATEUR, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1928, 1930.

UNITED STATES OPEN, 1923, 1926, 1929, 1930. BRITISH OPEN, 1926, 1927, 1930. BRITISH AMATEUR, 1930.

Additionally, he won the first Georgia State Amateur Championship in 1916 at the age of 14; won the Southern Amateur Championship in 1917, 1920, and 1922; and played as a member of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1922, 1924, 1926, 1928 and 1930, being captain in the last two meetings, and never losing a match at singles.

At his retirement from competitive Golf in 1930 his status as First Official World Champion was assured by his winning in that year the British Amateur, the British Open, the United States Open and the United States Amateur Championships, known as the Grand Slam, and thus entrenching his record safely and forever within the Impregnable Quadrilateral of Golf.

MARK BROOKS WINS SOUTHERN AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP

Tarpon Springs, Florida—Mark Brooks of Fort Worth and the University of Texas added to his prestige as one of our leading amateur golfers with his victory in the Southern Amateur Championship. This was his second major title of the summer as he had just won the Texas State Amateur Championship a month earlier.

The 20-year-old, who will be a Junior at the University of Texas this fall, scrambled home with a final round 76 that was good enough to put his name on the Southern Golf Association Championship Trophy that already list golfers of some prominence like Hubert Green, Lanny Watkins, Ben Crenshaw and Bill Rogers.

Brooks returned scores of 70-69-74-76—289, 5 over par on Innisbrook's great but demanding Copperhead course, and was the winner by a margin of three strokes over Jack Veghte, Clearwater, Florida and Tommy Moore, New Orleans, Louisiana. Veghte had rounds of 74-71-73-74—292 and Moore's rounds were 74-72-74-72—292.

This was the second straight year that Veghte has finished as runner-up in the Southern Amateur, having also been tied for 2nd at Houston in 1980. Tommy Moore, an 18-year-old from New Orleans, who tied for the runner-up spot, has just finished his freshman year at Oklahoma State University and has an excellent record as a Junior golfer. It is anticipated that he will continue to make his presence known in amateur golf circles.

Finishing in 4th place was Fred Ridley of Tampa, Florida with a four round total of 293. Ridley, who is a past U. S. Amateur Champion, had rounds of 72-77-72-72. Fifth place was shared by three players with scores of 295; Wallace Adams, Jr., Glenwood, Georgia; Bill Holstead, Wichita Falls, Texas, and Chip Holcombe, Ft. Walton Beach, Florida.

Rounding out the top ten finishers, actually the top eleven, were four players tied for 8th place at 296. These were Jay Townsend, Tequesta, Florida; Danny Mijovic, Ft. Worth, Texas; Bill Hadden, Hamden, Connecticut and Miami Beach, Florida, and Stuart Smith, Nashville, Tenn.

Brooks was either tied for the lead or in sole command throughout the entire tournament. After a first round 70, he shared the lead with Gene Sauers of Savannah, Georgia, and Robert Sauerberg of Lakeland, Florida. At the end of the second round Brooks had taken charge and was 3 strokes ahead of Holcombe and 4 strokes ahead of Holstead. He continued to lead after 54 holes of play with Holstead still in a challenging position 3 shots back while Smith and Hadden had moved closer to the leader and were both 4 shots behind.

The expected shootout between Brooks and his fellow Texan, Holstead, did not materialize in the final round. Holstead got off to a poor start with a double bogey on the initial hole, and he was unable to recover and ended up in a tie for 5th place.

Now Veghte enters the picture. At the end of the front nine of the final round he had narrowed Brooks' lead to a thin one stroke margin.] However, Brooks rallied to a steady even par back nine while Veghte could do no better than 7 pars and 2 bogeys. Thus Brooks finished with the same 3 stroke lead which he held at the beginning of play for the final round.

This great Copperhead Course at Innisbrook is truly a magnificent test of golf and the playing conditions were superb. There is no question why

it is rated by golf experts and golf panels as one of the outstanding golf courses in the United States. The assistance given by Jay Overton, Vice President for Golf Operations, and his most competent staff contributed immeasurably to the great success of this 75th Southern Golf Association Championship.

As usual in major golf events, it seems to be in vogue for at least one controversy to be instigated during the course of ploy and it is usually by an outsider who is generally ignorant of the true facts. In this instance it was an unwarranted and completely erroneous report by a member of the press in his description of the mowing of the greens after the second round of play. Evidently, someone failed to tell Stuart Smith of Nashville about this, or he did not read the newspaper article, because he proceeded to shoot a 4 under par 67 during the third round, and this was the low round recorded during the entire tournament.

In addition to being the winner of the Championship, Brooks was also the medalist and his 36 hole total of 70-69—139 was 3 under par.

The Bob Jones Trophy was won by Florida, with a 36 hole team score of 578, based on the performance of Chip Holcombe, Ft. Walton Beach (142); Jack Veghte, Clearwater (145); Kevin Janiga, Lake Placid (145) and John Keller, Pompano Beach (146).



HENDLEY WINS 1981 JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

Tuscaloosa, Alabama—Eleven states were represented in the Ninth Annual Southern Golf Association Junior Championship which was played at the NorthRiver Yacht Club over the period June 16, 17, 18, 1981.

The winner, taking both the overall championship and the 15-17 age division title, was Stuart Hendley of Houston, Texas with rounds of $73 \div 73$ -69—215. This was three strokes better than the second place finisher Tom Krystyn of Jacksonville, Florida who posted 75-70-73—218.

Third place was shared by three players with identical scores. Mobile's Greg Jones with rounds of 77-73-73—220 tied with Jim Kelson of Grand Prairie, Texas who shot 74-70-76—220; and T. J. Jackson of Mobile who shot 73-75-72—220.

Scott Verplank of Dallas was sixth at 76-72-73—221, and Alex Lid back of Baton Rouge and Jon Leonard of Warner Robbins, Georgia tied for seventh, Lidback had rounds of 78-70-74—222, and Leonard 73-75-74—222.

At the end of the first round Hendley and Jackson were tied for the lead with a thin one stroke margin over the remainder of the field. Kelson took charge after a fine second round 70 to gain the leader's position with a one stroke advantage over Krystyn and a two stroke advantage over Hendley. However, the 2 under par 69 which was fired by Hendley in the final round overcame this deficit and provided him the three stroke margin.

Hendley discovered the secret to playing the demanding NorthRiver course during Monday's practice round. In order to score, it is imperative to keep the ball in play off the tee, and it did not take him long to realize he did not need his driver to score. During the 54 holes of tournament play, he used his driver only 11 times. Hendley, who is 16, will have the opportunity to defend his title in 1982 at the Junior Championship which will be conducted over the course of the Country Club of Jackson, Mississippi.

The 13-14 age division was won by Brian Nelson of Tyler, Texas. His consistant rounds of 75-76-78 totaled 229, and this was six strokes better than the second place winner, Terry Andrews of Bastrop, Louisiana who posted 81-76-78—235. In third place was David Toms of Bossier City, Louisiana who posted 81-81-74—236. Flint Nelson of Houston, Texas was fourth with rounds of 79-77-81—237.

The team championship was won by Texas. The team consisted of Stuart Hendley, Houston; Jim Kelson, Grand Prairie; Scott Verplank, Dallas and Ricky Cole, Conroe.

The first Hall of Fame inductee was appropriately Robert Tyre Jones, Jr. The award was made in July, 1972, posthumously, at Green Island Country Club, Columbus, Georgia during the play of the Southern Golf Association 1972 Championship



It was with great pleasure that the Southern Golf Association Directors elected Lewis W. Oehmig as our inductee for 1981. Lew has been outstanding in all the criteria expected of an inductee and has had a distinguished competitive career as well as demonstrating his administrative ability and has been outstanding in the promotion of amateur golf. Lew's competitive golf career includes many outstanding championships and accomplishments—so many, that only the most important can be listed. In his college days Lew was a National Intercollegiate Co-medalist as well as Semi-finalist in the 1937 NCAA Championship. He was Captain cf the University of Virginia Golf Team in 1938. Lew's record in the Tennessee State Amateur Championship will never be equaled as he has won the event eight times spanning five decades beginning in 1937 and the last time being in 1971. He has been the Tennessee Senior Champion five times; Tennessee Open Low Amateur two times; a medalist in the Southern Amateur Championship in 1963 as well as being a Semi-finalist in 1956. Since becoming a Senior Golfer, Lew has set a record for the number of times being a finalist in the USGA Senior Amateur Championship—having been the winner in 1972 and 1976 as well as runner-up in 1973, 1977 and 1979. He was the winner of the International Senior Championship in 1976 land he served as Captain of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1977. He has been elected as Captain of the USSGA International Team for 1982-83.

Lew Oehmig is a blend of what many amateurs aspire to be—a championship golfer and a successful businessman. His work in administrative and promotional golf is exemplified by the man himself whose personal qualities make him appealing and an inspiration to the younger men in golf. It was for these same qualities and abilities as a golfer that he was chosen by the United States Golf Association to Captain the U.S. Walker Cup Team in 1977. Lew Oehmig will long be remembered in the golf world for his many contributions to the game of golf.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION (Approved 1975)

I, the undersigned, a natural person of the age of twenty-one years or more, do hereby form a non-profit corporation under the laws of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Non-Profit Corporation Act," and the several amendments thereto, and to that end do hereby set forth:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is: SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE II PERIOD OF DURATION

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The obects and purposes of the Association shall be to promote the game of golf, to protect the interests of its members, to hold such tournaments as may be decided upon by the Board of Directors, and to suitably recognize the winners in the Championship or other contests. The Association shall be empowered to engage in any lawful activity for which corporations may be formed under the Non-Profit Corporation Act of the State of North Carolina.

ARTICLE IV

Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects and purposes of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. A regularly organized golf club is a club which is composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs and operate permanently at one golf course which they need not control. Upon the filing of these Articles of Incorporation, the initial membership shall consist of those clubs named on the Roster of Membership attached hereto.

ARTICLE V DIRECTORS

The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number, terms, qualifications and method of election of Directors shall be set forth in the bylaws.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall

be thirty-nine (39).

ARTICLE VI REGISTERED OFFICE

The address of the initial registered office of the Association is Suite 3500, ONE NCNB PLAZA, Charlotte, North Carolina 28280, and the address of the initial registered agent at such address is Richard E. Thigpen, Jr.

ARTICLE VII NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

The Association is a non-profit organization, no part of the capital or net earnings of which shall inure to the benefit of any member or any private individual. Upon the dissolution of the Association, any assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations shall be distributed to the United States Golf Association provided it has retained its exempt status under Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code. In the event the exempt status of the United State Golf Association has been revoked, the assets of the Association shall be distributed to an organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which organization or organizations are not within the definition of a private foundation under Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code,

BYLAWS OF SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I Membership

Section 1. Qualification for Membership. Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. As used herein, "any regularly organized golf club" means a permanent golf club composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs through officers and committees whom they select. Such clubs shall operate permanently at one golf course which its members have the right to play but said club need not control the course where it plays.

Section 2. Application for Membership. Application for membership shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Association, in such form and accompanied by such information as the Secretary deems necessary for the Board of Directors to have before passing on such application. Dues for one (1) full year shall accompany the application.

Section 3. **Election to Membership.** Election to membership shall be by the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present at any regular or special meeting at which such application is considered.

Section 4. Suspension or Expulsion of Members. Except as provided in Section 5, below, a member may be suspended or expelled from the Association with or without cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Board of Directors present in person.

Section 5. **Dues.** The Board of Directors shall fix the annual dues, which shall be payable prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Members of the club whose dues are not paid by that time shall be barred from entering all Association events during the period of delinquency. Any member whose annual dues are unpaid for sixty days (60) days after the end of the fiscal year shall be automatically dropped from membership in the Association.

ARTICLE II Membership Meetings

Section 1. Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held during the week and at the place of the annual Southern Championship Tournament, the exact day and hour to be fixed by the President of the Association. The Secretary of the Association shall give at least fourteen (14) days notice thereof to each member.

The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows:

- 1. Roll Call.
- 2. Minutes of Previous Meeting.
- 3 Secretary's Report.
- 4. Treasurer's Report.
- 5. Committee Reports
- 6. President's Report.
- 7. Old and New Business.
- 8. Elections.
- 9. Adjournment.

Section 2. **Special Meetings.** A special meeting of the Association may be held on call of the President or by written request directed to the Secretary and signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, provided that at least ten (10) days written notice thereof is given to each member. Such notice shall contain a statement of the purposes of the subject meeting.

Section 3. **Representation.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association, each member shall have the right to be represented, but in person only, by one voting delegate or alternate.

Section 4. **Quorum.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association those representatives of members, present in person, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting.

ARTICLE III Board of Directors

Section 1. **General Powers and Duties.** The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Number, Term, and Qualification. The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President and a Vice President in charge of Senior Affairs and a Vice President in charge of Junior Affairs and not less than twenty-five (25) nor more than forty-five (45) other directors. All directors shall hold office through the next annual meeting of the Association or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. All members of the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of member club of the Association.

Section 3. **Election.** Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the member clubs by a vote of a majority of the voting delegates present in person. All vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by the remaining Directors, at any regular or special meeting, by the vote of the majority of the Directors in a meeting at which a quorum is present. The Director thus elected to fill any vacancy shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the members and until a successor is elected and qualified.

Section 4. **Meetings.** The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Association. In addition, special meetings may be called by or at the written request of the President or any three Directors. The person authorized by the Board to give notice of special meetings of the Board may designate the place, for the holding of any special meeting.

Section 5. **Notice.** Written notice of annual and special meetings of the Board shall be given to each Director at least ten (10) days in advance of said meeting. However, such notice may be waived as provided in these Bylaws. The business to be transacted at annual meetings need not be specified in the notice of such meetings, unless specifically required by law or by these Bylaws. Notice of a special meeting shall set forth the purpose for which the meeting is called.

Section 6. **Quorum.** Those Directors in attendance shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. Unless otherwise required by charter or statute, the act of a majority of the Directors present at any properly convened meeting at which there is a quorum shall be deemed the act of the Board.

Section 7. Directors Emeritus. At any annual meeting, the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present in person, may elect

Directors emeritus to serve for life and those so elected shall have seat and voice on the Board of Directors but no vote

Section 8. Associate Directors. The President shall have the authority to appoint associate Directors for terms not to exceed one (1) year, and those so appointed shall have seat and voice but no vote.

Section 9. **Committees.** The Board of Directors may establish such standing or other committees as they consider proper or for the best interests of the Association and the membership of all such committees shall consist of those persons appointed by the President. The President of the Association shall ex-officio be a member of all committees.

Section 10. **Rules.** The Board of Directors shall make all rules governing the conduct and management of the Association which it deems advisable and which are not in conflict with the purpose of the Association or its Bylaws.

Section 11. Compensation, Directors shall receive no salary for their services.

ARTICLE IV
Waiver of Notice

Whenever, under the laws of the State of North Carolina or by provision of these Bylaws, a waiver in writing is signed by persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, it shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

ARTICLE V Officers

Section 1. **Officers and Term.** The officers of the Association shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Vice President for Senior Affairs, a Vice President for Junior Affairs, an Executive Secretary, a Field Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be elected by the Board of Directors. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be merged into the single office of Secretary-Treasurer at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office for one year or until his successor is elected and qualified.

Section 2. Vacancies. Vacancies in an office may be filled by the Directors at any regular or special meeting.

Section 3. **Election and Removal.** Any officer may be elected or removed without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors present in person at a regular or special meeting.

Section 4. **President.** The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board, shall be the chief executive officer of the Association, and shall have general supervision and management of the affairs of the Association subject, however, to the control, when exercised, of the Board of Directors. He shall make reports to the Directors and members and perform all such other duties as are incident to this office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. First Vice President. The First Vice President shall perform all such duties as may be properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President and, in the absence or inability of the President, shall exercise and perform the functions and exercise all the powers of the President.

Section 6. Second Vice President. The Second Vice President, in the absence of the First Vice President, shall perform the duties of that office.

Section 7. Vice President for Senior Affairs. The Vice President for Senior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for seniors.

Section 8. Vice President for Junior Afairs. The Vice President for Junior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for juniors.

Section 9. **Executive Secretary.** The Executive Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Directors and members and shall make such reports and perform such other duties as are incident to his office, or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

Section 10. **Field Secretary.** The Field Secretary shall have charge of the Association's books and records and shall receive and disburse all funds and shall provide the Treasurer with accounts of all transactions concerning the financial condition of the Association. He shall receive and process all membership applications and entries for tournaments. He shall be responsible for making arrangements for tournaments and assisting in the conduct of competitions as directed by the Board of Directors or the President and shall perform such other duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him.

Section 11. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall have custody of all monies and securities of the Association and shall keep regular books of account. He shall disburse the funds of the Association as may be ordered by the Board of Directors or the President, and shall render an account of all his transactions as Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Association, and shall perform all duties incident to his office or that are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sums and with such securities as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. He shall report in writing to the Board of Directors and the members of the Association at the meeting of each body.

Section 12. Compensation. The salaries, if any, of the employees and officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI Annual Championship Tournament and Other Tournaments

Section 1. **Tournaments**, Each year a tournament for the Amateur Championship of the South shall be held under the direction and management of the Board of Directors, or such committees as they may designate, and suitable prizes shall be awarded in the championship. In addition, the Association shall conduct such other tournaments as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. The Board shall determine the method of play in such tournaments or delegate such power or any part thereof to any duly established committee.

Section 2. **Site.** The Board shall select the sites for all tournaments sponsored by the Association. The site of the succeeding years' championship shall be determined at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. **Entry Fees.** The entry fee for the championship tournament and all other tournaments shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The entries shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Eligibility. No player shall be eligible to compete in a championship tournament unless (1) he is a bona fide member of a club belonging to the Association and in good standing, and has been a member of the club from which he is entered for sixty (60) days prior to the date of the championship competition unless said competitor shall be otherwise eligible by reason of his membership in some other club or (2) has competed within the calendar year of the tournament in which he is entered as a member of a golf team of a college or university located within one

of the states named in Article I, Section 1, which team represents said school in regularly scheduled intercollegiate golf competition or (3) has received an invitation from a special committee of former Southern Golf Association Presidents who shall have the right, but not the obligation, to invite one or more competitors of national or international standing who are not otherwise eligible to compete in the Southern Golf Association Championship. Any person who is proved, to the satisfaction of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting to have been guilty of fraudulent act or other discreditable conduct of any kind, may be declared by the Board of Directors to be ineligible to compete in any competition, suspended or expelled.

ARTICLE VII Rules of Tournaments

All tournament competition shall be played strictly in accordance with the rules of golf approved by the United States Golf Association with such local rules as the Rules Committee of this Association may adopt or authorize. All other disputes shall be decided by the Tournament Committee, whose decision shall be final.

ARTICLE VIII Disputes Between Member Clubs

All complaints and disputes between member clubs of this Association shall be decided by the Board of Directors, excluding representatives of any member club involved in the dispute being considered.

ARTICLE IX Amendments

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, amend and repeal the Bylaws of this Association by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Directors present at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Such action of the Board shall be subject to review by the members of the Association.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association, since its founding in 1902, has conducted its affairs in such manner as to promote the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has sponsored championships which have produced players of regional, national, and international fame who have been a credit to the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has trained and provided administrators for the game of golf who have enhanced the game at all levels, both regional, national, and international; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has supported turf research, sponsored scholarships and by other means has made more meaningful and worthwhile the game of golf for all golfers; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association recognizes the international language of sports and particularly the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association desires to increase its support of golf on the international level and to promote, through the game of golf, better international relations and a better understanding among people around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Southern Golf Association does hereby endorse the development of a people-to-people relationship at the international level through the promotion of the game of golf and international, amateur competition to the end that international goodwill and understanding might be strengthened; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the officers of the Southern Golf Association are hereby authorized and directed to implement those programs deemed reasonable to achieve the objectives of this Association.
