Commemorating his career in Golf and the greatest record yet achieved in the competitive phases of the game, this trophy is dedicated to

### **ROBERT TYRE JONES, JR.**

Who was reared in and played from Atlanta, Georgia, and who in the space of fifteen years, from 1916 through 1930, played in thirty-one major championships of the United States and Great Britain, and retired at the age of 28, with this list of victories:

UNITED STATES AMATEUR, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1928,  
1930.

UNITED STATES OPEN, 1923, 1926, 1929, 1930.

BRITISH OPEN, 1926, 1927, 1930.

BRITISH AMATEUR, 1930.

Additionally, he won the first Georgia State Amateur Championship in 1916 at the age of 14; won the Southern Amateur Championship in 1917, 1920, and 1922; and played as a member of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1922, 1924, 1926, 1928 and 1930, being captain in the last two meetings, and never losing a match at singles.

At his retirement from competitive Golf in 1930 his status as First Official World Champion was assured by his winning in that year the British Amateur, the British Open, the United States Open and the United States Amateur Championships, known as the Grand Slam, and thus entrenching his record safely and forever within the Impregnable Quadrilateral of Golf.

## **STEVE LOWERY WINS 1982 SOUTHERN AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP**

Hilton Head Island, South Carolina—Steve Lowery of Birmingham, Alabama emerged as the winner of the 76th Annual Southern Amateur Championship, but only after a head to head match with John Spelman of Hilton Head Island, South Carolina.

The winner was decided by a "sudden death" playoff since both players had completed the 72 holes of tournament play tied at 6 under par scores of 282. On the first hole of the playoff Lowery had a birdie to Spelman's par and thus Lowery earned the crown as 1982 Southern Amateur Champion.

Lowery returned scores of 73-68-71-70—282, 6 under par on the great Devil's Elbow South Course at Moss Creek Plantation. Spelman's scores were 69-73-71-69—282, also 6 under par for the 72 hole route. Jay Sigel of Berwyn, Pennsylvania finished third with rounds of 67-73-73-71—284.

Fourth place was won by Lee Rinker of Stuart, Florida with a four round total of 285 consisting of rounds of 70-69-76-70. Finishing in fifth place was Scott Dunlap of Sarasota, Florida with rounds of 71-75-70-70—286.

Sixth place was shared by two players with scores of 289; Jack Veghte, Clearwater, Florida and Ray Biancalana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. In 8th place was John Inman of Greensboro, North Carolina at 291; while Brad Faxon of Somerset, South Carolina was ninth at 292.

Four players shared the tenth place, tied at 293. These were Jeff Goettman, Durham, North Carolina; Stuart Smith, Nashville, Tennessee; Ignacio DeLeon, Sugarland, Texas and Danny Yates, Atlanta, Georgia.

At the end of the first 18 holes of play Jay Sigel took the lead by a thin one stroke margin by reason of his fine opening round 67 which is 5 under par. Close on his heels, however, were David Leveille of Baton Rouge, Louisiana with an opening round 68 followed by Spelman, Rinker, Mark Brooks, defending champion from Ft. Worth, and Dr. Gayle Sanchez from Baton Rouge, who each had rounds of 69. At this point one would have to consider Sigel as the favorite because of his proven record in both national and international competition.

However, at the end of 36 holes of play, Lee Rinker had taken over the lead and his 139 total, 5 under par, also gave him the medalist honors. At this point Rinker enjoyed a one stroke advantage over Sigel and a two stroke advantage over Lowery and Inman.

At the conclusion of 54 holes of play the lead changed again with Lowery in 1st place at 212, 4 under par. Following closely, at only 1 stroke behind was the trio of Spelman, Sigel and Inman. Also, at this point, Rinker and Veghte were only 3 strokes behind Lowery and all indications were that the Championship could still belong to any one of these closely-grouped players.

Spelman had a very fine closing round of 69, 3 under par, but Lowery refused to buckle under the pressure and his final round 70, 2 under par, gave him a total score of 282. Thus Lowery and Spelman were tied for the Championship. The first hole birdie by Lowery in the sudden-death playoff made him the winner.

Both Lowery and Spelman carry great credentials based on their past records and their respective college performances; and they both played

superb golf and each was deserving of being the Champion. However, only one Champion can be recognized, and it is fitting that Steve Lowery's name will be added to the illustrious listing of winners of the Southern Amateur Championship.

The Devil's Elbow South Course at Moss Creek Plantation is truly a magnificent layout and a great test of golf. The excellent playing conditions presented a delightful challenge for all participants. The cooperation and assistance received from Tim Moss, Tournament Director and Golf Professional, and his staff, were outstanding and contributed immeasurably to the tremendous success of the 76th Southern Golf Association Championship.

The Bob Jones Trophy, awarded annually to the low team of four players from the same state (based on the first 2 rounds of tournament play), was won by Florida for the second year in a row. Their 36 hole team score was 575, based on the performance of Lee Rinker, Stuart (139); Jack Veghte, Clearwater (142); Scott Dunlap, Sarasota (146) and Ken Mattiace, Ponte Vedra Beach (148).

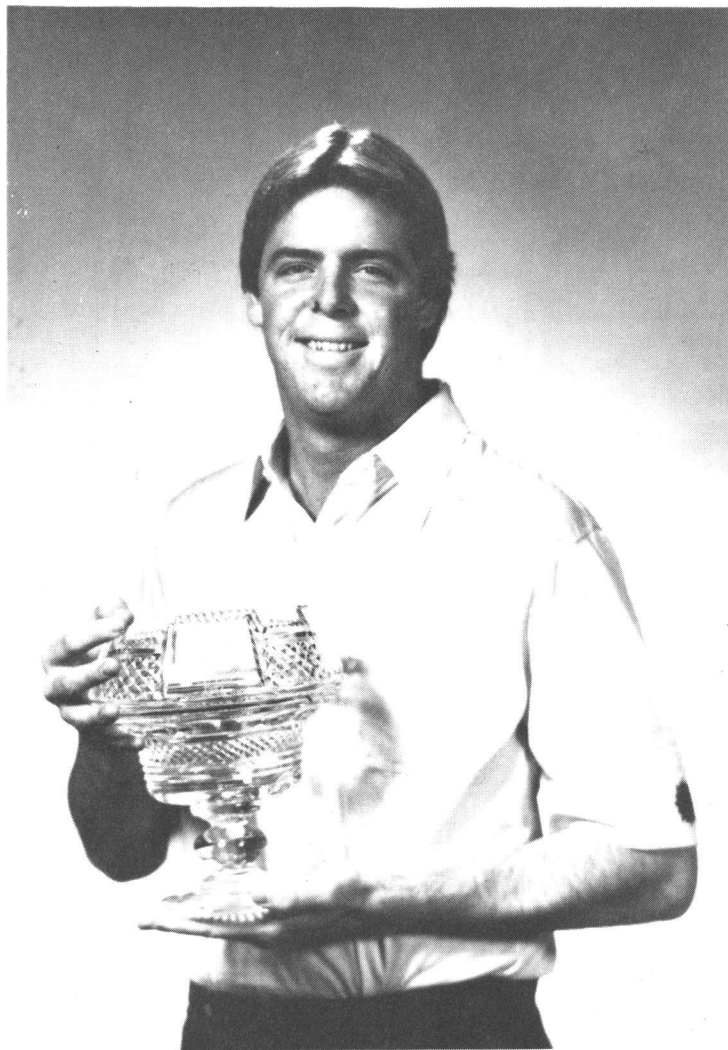

### **DOUG McLEOD WINS 1982 JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP**

Jackson, Mississippi—The Country Club of Jackson, Jackson, Mississippi, was the site of the Tenth Annual Southern Golf Association Junior Championship which was played over the period June 15, 16 and 17, 1982. The scheduled 54 hole competition had to be reduced to 36 holes because of weather conditions which made play impossible in the scheduled 2nd round.

Ten states were represented and the field consisted of junior players with outstanding credentials. These included Stuart Hendley of Houston, Texas, the 1981 SGA Junior Champion and winner of the Doug Sanders International Championship; Tim Fleming, Ocean Springs, Mississippi, who finished 2nd in the Doug Sanders International Championship; Scott Verplank, Dallas, Texas, who came to this championship from winning the Texas State Amateur title the week before; Chris Gustin, Alabama Junior Champion; Jarrett Sharp, Tennessee Junior Champion; and Chip Sullivan, two-time Louisiana State High School Champion.

The winner, taking both the overall championship and the 15-17 age division title, was Doug McLeod of Mobile, Alabama, with rounds of 71-71—142 which is 2 under par. In second place was Scott Verplank with rounds of 70-72—142. The tie was decided by a "sudden-death" playoff and McLeod gained his victory on the first hole with a par 4.

Third place was shared by three players, all with the same total scores at even par 144. Cole Thompson, Abilene, Texas had rounds of 71-73; Vance Veazey, Senatobia, Mississippi had rounds of 69-75; and Scott Warzecha of Daleville, Alabama had rounds of 71-73.

Stuart Hendley was sixth at 69-76—145, and two players with identical scores of 73-74—147 were tied for seventh place. They were Beau Fields of Marietta, Georgia and T. J. Jackson of Mobile, Alabama.

At the end of the first round the leader board was quite impressive showing eight contestants better than par. Vance Veazey and Stuart Hendley led this group of fine junior players with 3 under par 69's. Scott Verplank and Greg Jones, Mobile, Alabama each had 70. At 1 under par 71 were Doug McLeod, Cole Thompson, Scott Warzecha and Glen Day, Poplarville, Mississippi. The players attributed the low scores to the great condition of the course and as quoted "the greens are putting super—the greens are so true."

The second round, scheduled for Wednesday, was rained out, and the 54 hole championship was altered to a 36 hole format.

The final round produced only 2 rounds under par, 71's by the eventual champion, Doug McLeod and by Todd Franks, Ft. Worth, Texas.

The 13-14 age division was won by Tripp Davis of Decatur, Georgia. His rounds of 77-80 totaled 157, and this was two strokes better than the second place winner, Stacy Smith of Houston, Texas who shot 79-80—159. There was a tie for third place at 161. Matching cards gave third to Mark Mills of Corinth, Mississippi who posted 80-81; and fourth place winner with 84-77 was Warren Overton of Little Rock, Arkansas.

The team championship was won by Texas with a total score of 580 with Alabama placing second at 581. The Texas team consisted of Scott Verplank, Dallas; Cole Thompson, Abilene; Stuart Hendley, Houston; and Brian Nelson, Tyler.

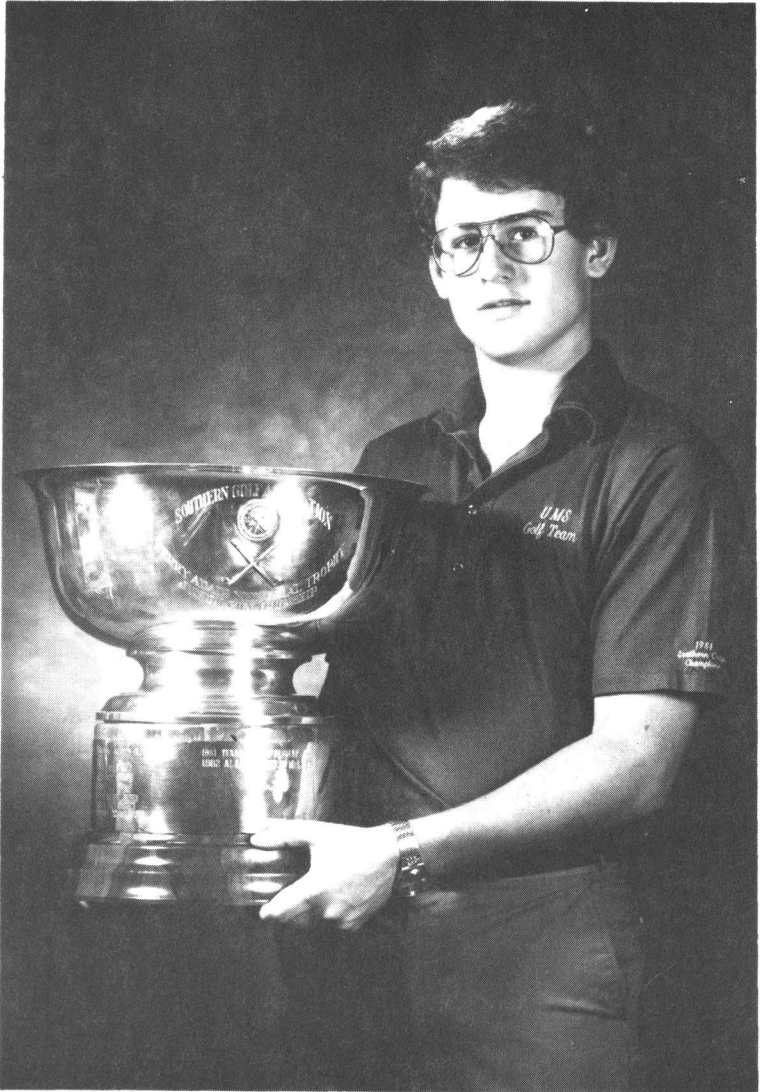

### **ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION (Approved 1975)**

I, the undersigned, a natural person of the age of twenty-one years or more, do hereby form a non-profit corporation under the laws of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Non-Profit Corporation Act," and the several amendments thereto, and to that end do hereby set forth:

#### **ARTICLE I NAME**

The name of the corporation is: SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

#### **ARTICLE II PERIOD OF DURATION**

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

#### **ARTICLE III PURPOSE**

The objects and purposes of the Association shall be to promote the game of golf, to protect the interests of its members, to hold such tournaments as may be decided upon by the Board of Directors, and to suitably recognize the winners in the Championship or other contests. The Association shall be empowered to engage in any lawful activity for which corporations may be formed under the Non-Profit Corporation Act of the State of North Carolina.

#### **ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects and purposes of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. A regularly organized golf club is a club which is composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs and operate permanently at one golf course which they need not control. Upon the filing of these Articles of Incorporation, the initial membership shall consist of those clubs named on the Roster of Membership attached hereto.

#### **ARTICLE V DIRECTORS**

The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number, terms, qualifications and method of election of Directors shall be set forth in the bylaws.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be thirty-nine (39).

**ARTICLE VI  
REGISTERED OFFICE**

The address of the initial registered office of the Association is Suite 3500, ONE NCNB PLAZA, Charlotte, North Carolina 28280, and the address of the initial registered agent at such address is Richard E. Thigpen, Jr.

**ARTICLE VII  
NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION**

The Association is a non-profit organization, no part of the capital or net earnings of which shall inure to the benefit of any member or any private individual. Upon the dissolution of the Association, any assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations shall be distributed to the United States Golf Association provided it has retained its exempt status under Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code. In the event the exempt status of the United State Golf Association has been revoked, the assets of the Association shall be distributed to an organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which organization or organizations are not within the definition of a private foundation under Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code.

## BYLAWS OF SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

### ARTICLE I Membership

Section 1. **Qualification for Membership.** Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. As used herein, "any regularly organized golf club" means a permanent golf club composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs through officers and committees whom they select. Such clubs shall operate permanently at one golf course which its members have the right to play but said club need not control the course where it plays.

Section 2. **Application for Membership.** Application for membership shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Association, in such form and accompanied by such information as the Secretary deems necessary for the Board of Directors to have before passing on such application. Dues for one (1) full year shall accompany the application.

Section 3. **Election to Membership.** Election to membership shall be by the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present at any regular or special meeting at which such application is considered.

Section 4. **Suspension or Expulsion of Members.** Except as provided in Section 5, below, a member may be suspended or expelled from the Association with or without cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Board of Directors present in person.

Section 5. **Dues.** The Board of Directors shall fix the annual dues, which shall be payable prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Members of the club whose dues are not paid by that time shall be barred from entering all Association events during the period of delinquency. Any member whose annual dues are unpaid for sixty days (60) days after the end of the fiscal year shall be automatically dropped from membership in the Association.

### ARTICLE II Membership Meetings

Section 1. **Annual Meeting.** The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held during the week and at the place of the annual Southern Championship Tournament, the exact day and hour to be fixed by the President of the Association. The Secretary of the Association shall give at least fourteen (14) days notice thereof to each member.

The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows:

1. Roll Call.
2. Minutes of Previous Meeting.
3. Secretary's Report.
4. Treasurer's Report.
5. Committee Reports.
6. President's Report.
7. Old and New Business.
8. Elections.
9. Adjournment.

Section 2. **Special Meetings.** A special meeting of the Association may be held on call of the President or by written request directed to the Secretary and signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, provided that at least ten (10) days written notice thereof is given to each member. Such notice shall contain a statement of the purposes of the subject meeting.

Section 3. **Representation.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association, each member shall have the right to be represented, but in person only, by one voting delegate or alternate.

Section 4. **Quorum.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association those representatives of members, present in person, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting.

### **ARTICLE III**

#### **Board of Directors**

Section 1. **General Powers and Duties.** The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

Section 2. **Number, Term, and Qualification.** The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President and a Vice President in charge of Senior Affairs and a Vice President in charge of Junior Affairs and not less than twenty-five (25) nor more than forty-five (45) other directors. All directors shall hold office through the next annual meeting of the Association or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. All members of the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of member club of the Association.

Section 3. **Election.** Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the member clubs by a vote of a majority of the voting delegates present in person. All vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by the remaining Directors, at any regular or special meeting, by the vote of the majority of the Directors in a meeting at which a quorum is present. The Director thus elected to fill any vacancy shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the members and until a successor is elected and qualified.

Section 4. **Meetings.** The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Association. In addition, special meetings may be called by or at the written request of the President or any three Directors. The person authorized by the Board to give notice of special meetings of the Board may designate the place, for the holding of any special meeting.

Section 5. **Notice.** Written notice of annual and special meetings of the Board shall be given to each Director at least ten (10) days in advance of said meeting. However, such notice may be waived as provided in these Bylaws. The business to be transacted at annual meetings need not be specified in the notice of such meetings, unless specifically required by law or by these Bylaws. Notice of a special meeting shall set forth the purpose for which the meeting is called.

Section 6. **Quorum.** Those Directors in attendance shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. Unless otherwise required by charter or statute, the act of a majority of the Directors present at any properly convened meeting at which there is a quorum shall be deemed the act of the Board.

Section 7. **Directors Emeritus.** At any annual meeting, the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present in person, may elect

Directors emeritus to serve for life and those so elected shall have seat and voice on the Board of Directors but no vote.

**Section 8. Associate Directors.** The President shall have the authority to appoint associate Directors for terms not to exceed one (1) year, and those so appointed shall have seat and voice but no vote.

**Section 9. Committees.** The Board of Directors may establish such standing or other committees as they consider proper or for the best interests of the Association and the membership of all such committees shall consist of those persons appointed by the President. The President of the Association shall ex-officio be a member of all committees.

**Section 10. Rules.** The Board of Directors shall make all rules governing the conduct and management of the Association which it deems advisable and which are not in conflict with the purpose of the Association or its Bylaws.

**Section 11. Compensation.** Directors shall receive no salary for their services.

### **ARTICLE IV**

#### **Waiver of Notice**

Whenever, under the laws of the State of North Carolina or by provision of these Bylaws, a waiver in writing is signed by persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, it shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

### **ARTICLE V**

#### **Officers**

**Section 1. Officers and Term.** The officers of the Association shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Vice President for Senior Affairs, a Vice President for Junior Affairs, an Executive Secretary, a Field Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be elected by the Board of Directors. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be merged into the single office of Secretary-Treasurer at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office for one year or until his successor is elected and qualified.

**Section 2. Vacancies.** Vacancies in an office may be filled by the Directors at any regular or special meeting.

**Section 3. Election and Removal.** Any officer may be elected or removed without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors present in person at a regular or special meeting.

**Section 4. President.** The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board, shall be the chief executive officer of the Association, and shall have general supervision and management of the affairs of the Association subject, however, to the control, when exercised, of the Board of Directors. He shall make reports to the Directors and members and perform all such other duties as are incident to this office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors.

**Section 5. First Vice President.** The First Vice President shall perform all such duties as may be properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President and, in the absence or inability of the President, shall exercise and perform the functions and exercise all the powers of the President.

**Section 6. Second Vice President.** The Second Vice President, in the absence of the First Vice President, shall perform the duties of that office.

**Section 7. Vice President for Senior Affairs.** The Vice President for Senior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for seniors.

Section 8. **Vice President for Junior Affairs.** The Vice President for Junior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for juniors.

Section 9. **Executive Secretary.** The Executive Secretary shall: keep minutes of the meetings of the Directors and members; have charge of the books and records; receive and disburse all funds; provide the Treasurer with accounts of all transactions concerning the financial condition of the Association; receive and process all membership applications and entries for tournaments; be responsible for making arrangements for tournaments and assisting in the conduct of competitions; perform such other duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

Section 10. **Field Secretary.** The Field Secretary shall make such reports and perform such duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

Section 11. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall have custody of all monies and securities of the Association and shall keep regular books of account. He shall disburse the funds of the Association as may be ordered by the Board of Directors or the President, and shall render an account of all his transactions as Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Association, and shall perform all duties incident to his office or that are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sums and with such securities as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. He shall report in writing to the Board of Directors and the members of the Association at the meeting of each body.

Section 12. **Compensation.** The salaries, if any, of the employees and officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

## ARTICLE VI

### Annual Championship Tournament and Other Tournaments

Section 1. **Tournaments.** Each year a tournament for the Amateur Championship of the South shall be held under the direction and management of the Board of Directors, or such committees as they may designate, and suitable prizes shall be awarded in the championship. In addition, the Association shall conduct such other tournaments as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. The Board shall determine the method of play in such tournaments or delegate such power or any part thereof to any duly established committee.

Section 2. **Site.** The Board shall select the sites for all tournaments sponsored by the Association. The site of the succeeding years' championship shall be determined at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. **Entry Fees.** The entry fee for the championship tournament and all other tournaments shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The entries shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. **Eligibility.** No player shall be eligible to compete in a championship tournament unless (1) he is a bona fide member of a club belonging to the Association and in good standing, and has been a member of the club from which he is entered for sixty (60) days prior to the date of the championship competition unless said competitor shall be otherwise eligible by reason of his membership in some other club or (2) has competed within the calendar year of the tournament in which he is entered as a member of a golf team of a college or university located within one

of the states named in Article I, Section 1, which team represents said school in regularly scheduled intercollegiate golf competition or (3) has received an invitation from a special committee of former Southern Golf Association Presidents who shall have the right, but not the obligation, to invite one or more competitors of national or international standing who are not otherwise eligible to compete in the Southern Golf Association Championship. Any person who is proved, to the satisfaction of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting to have been guilty of fraudulent act or other discreditable conduct of any kind, may be declared by the Board of Directors to be ineligible to compete in any competition, suspended or expelled.

### **ARTICLE VII**

#### **Rules of Tournaments**

All tournament competition shall be played strictly in accordance with the rules of golf approved by the United States Golf Association with such local rules as the Rules Committee of this Association may adopt or authorize. All other disputes shall be decided by the Tournament Committee, whose decision shall be final.

### **ARTICLE VIII**

#### **Disputes Between Member Clubs**

All complaints and disputes between member clubs of this Association shall be decided by the Board of Directors, excluding representatives of any member club involved in the dispute being considered.

### **ARTICLE IX**

#### **Amendments**

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, amend and repeal the Bylaws of this Association by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Directors present at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Such action of the Board shall be subject to review by the members of the Association.

**RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association, since its founding in 1902, has conducted its affairs in such manner as to promote the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has sponsored championships which have produced players of regional, national, and international fame who have been a credit to the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has trained and provided administrators for the game of golf who have enhanced the game at all levels, both regional, national, and international; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has supported turf research, sponsored scholarships and by other means has made more meaningful and worthwhile the game of golf for all golfers; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association recognizes the international language of sports and particularly the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association desires to increase its support of golf on the international level and to promote, through the game of golf, better international relations and a better understanding among people around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Southern Golf Association does hereby endorse the development of a people-to-people relationship at the international level through the promotion of the game of golf and international, amateur competition to the end that international goodwill and understanding might be strengthened; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the officers of the Southern Golf Association are hereby authorized and directed to implement those programs deemed reasonable to achieve the objectives of this Association.
