Commemorating his career in Golf and the greatest record yet achieved in the competitive phases of the game, this trophy is dedicated to

### **ROBERT TYRE JONES, JR.**

Who was reared in and played from Atlanta, Georgia, and who in the space of fifteen years, from 1916 through 1930, played in thirty-one major championships of the United States and Great Britain, and retired at the age of 28, with this list of victories:

UNITED STATES AMATEUR, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1928,  
1930.

UNITED STATES OPEN, 1923, 1926, 1929, 1930.

BRITISH OPEN, 1926, 1927, 1930.

BRITISH AMATEUR, 1930.

Additionally, he won the first Georgia State Amateur Championship in 1916 at the age of 14; won the Southern Amateur Championship in 1917, 1920, and 1922; and played as a member of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1922, 1924, 1926, 1928 and 1930, being captain in the last two meetings, and never losing a match at singles.

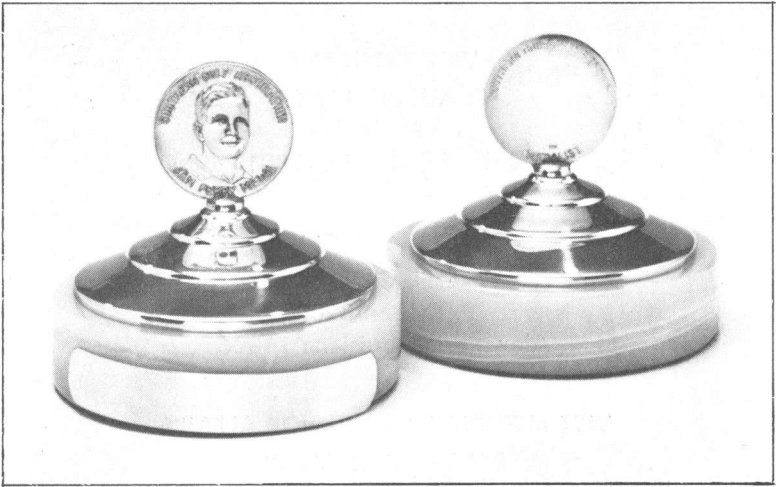
At his retirement from competitive Golf in 1930 his status as First Official World Champion was assured by his winning in that year the British Amateur, the British Open, the United States Open and the United States Amateur Championships, known as the Grand Slam, and thus entrenching his record safely and forever within the Impregnable Quadrilateral of Golf.

**LEN MATTIACE WINS  
SOUTHERN AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP**

Pinehurst, North Carolina — Len Mattiace of Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida emerged as the winner of the 79th Annual Southern Amateur Championship, but only after a "sudden-death" playoff with John Trivison of Hilton Head, South Carolina. Both players had completed the 72 holes of tournament play tied at 292. Mattiace won the third hole in the playoff and thus earned the crown as 1985 Southern Amateur Champion.

Mattiace returned scores of 69-74-75-74—292 on the demanding Dogwood course at the Country Club of North Carolina. Trivison's scores were 70-72-74-76—292. Third place was shared by two players, Mitchell Perry of Spring Lake, North Carolina and Darren Cole of University, Mississippi. Perry had rounds of 74-71-71-77 and Cole's rounds were 70-73-77-73.

Fifth place was also shared by two players. Doug Farr of Monroe, Louisiana and Jay Sigel of Berwyn, Pennsylvania at 294. Farr recorded rounds of 70-72-76-76 and Sigel's rounds were 71-72-73-78. Lee Janzen of Lakeland, Florida and Doug Lucci of Verona, New Jersey (a member of the Duke University golf team) tied for seventh place with scores of 295.

Larry White of Chattanooga, Tennessee finished in ninth place with a total score of 296. Tenth place was a tie between three players, each with scores of 297. These were Scott Dunlap of Sarasota, Florida; David Apperson of Memphis, Tennessee and Titus Harris of Houston, Texas.

Mattiace started the tournament with a fine opening round 69 that gave him a one shot advantage over the field. His second round 74 for a total of 143, one under par at the conclusion of 36 holes of play, kept him in the chase and only 1 shot out of the lead. However, a balky putter was the principal reason for his third round 75 that left him 2 strokes behind the three leading players at that point.

There was hardly a murmur of Len Mattiace's name most of the day during the last round as John Trivison, Mitchell Perry and Jay Sigel busily battled in the final group of players on the par 72, 7,032 yard Dogwood Course at the Country Club of North Carolina.

But the bogeys fell and the putts didn't and Mattiace's finishing score of 292, 74 for the day, became the score to beat as the final group approached the 18th green. Mattiace had finished 30 minutes earlier, hoping the four-foot putt he made for birdie on 18 would put him in perhaps second or third place. It did better than that — it wound up leaving him tied for the 72 hole route with Trivison who had a 76 for the day.

The two went on to a "sudden-death" playoff which Mattiace won on the par 3 third hole when Trivison's 6-iron shot went into the water behind the green. Both players had two-putted for par on the first playoff hole, then Trivison got up and down from the bunker to split the second hole. But his 6-iron proved to be too much on number 3.

Sigel had ended his challenge early, starting his final round with three boyers, on a day when all scores ballooned. The best effort in the field was a par 72 by defending champion Scott Dunlap, but he began the day far off the pace.

Mattiace has the unique distinction of being the second youngest person ever to win the Southern Amateur Championship. The youngest winner was Robert T. (Bobby) Jones, Jr. who was 15 when he won his first Southern Amateur Championship in 1917.

Len Mattiace, a 17 year old Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida native will enter Wake Forest University in the fall of 1985, and it is predicted that he will have an outstanding golf career, and he will make his mark in the amateur golf circles over the next several years.

The Sam Perry Medalist trophy was won by John Trivison. Although he and Doug Farr were tied at the completion of the first 36 holes, which is used to determine the medalist, Trivison won in the third round playoff against Farr.

The Bob Jones Trophy, awarded annually to the low team of four players from the same state, based on the first 36 holes of tournament play, was won by Florida for the second year in a row. Their team score was 583 based on the performance of Len Mattiace, Ponte Vedra Beach (143); Lee Janzen, Lakeland (144); Scott Dunlap, Sarasota (148); and Billy Varn, Jacksonville (148).

The Dogwood Course, Country Club of North Carolina, is truly a magnificent test of golf and it has served as the site of several prestigious events including the U. S. Amateur Championship. There is no question why it is rated by golf experts and golf panels as one of the outstanding golf courses in the United States. The cooperation and assistance given by Buck Adams, Golf Professional; George Thompson, Golf Course Superintendent; and Jim Horne, Club Manager — and their respective staffs — was outstanding and contributed immeasurably to the tremendous success of the 79th Southern Golf Amateur Championship.

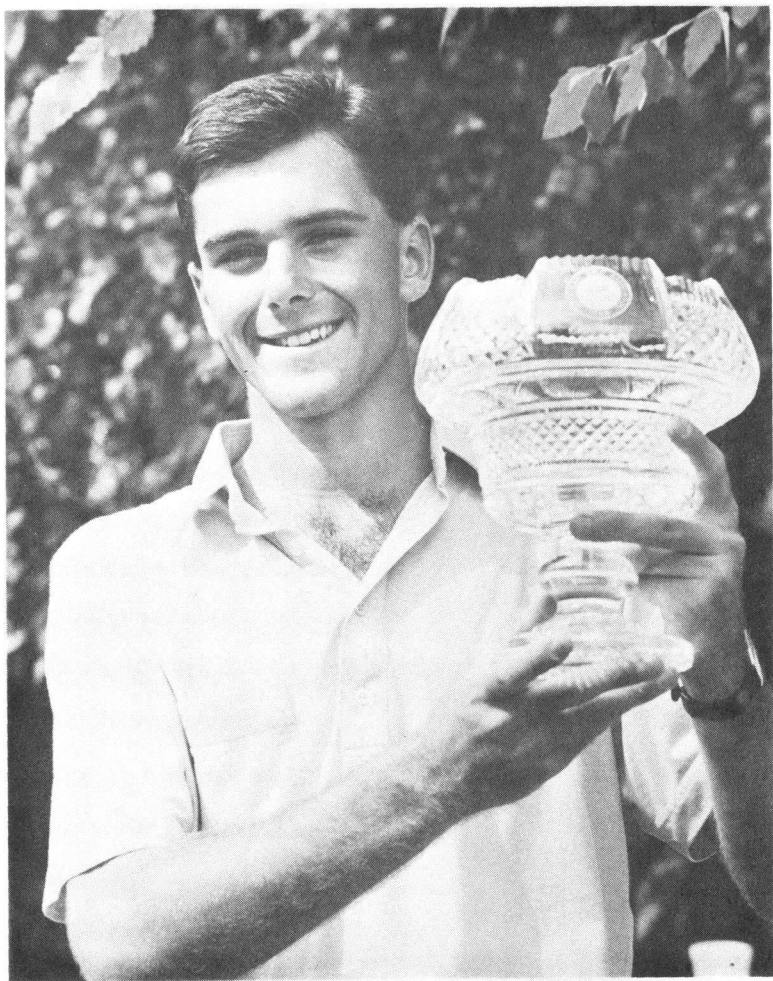

**IX INTERNATIONAL AMATEUR GOLF  
TOURNAMENT COPA SIMON BOLIVAR**

This international tournament is held every other year in one of the main cities of Venezuela and is sponsored by the Venezuelan Federation of Golf. 1985 was the second time the Southern Golf Association has been invited to send a team to participate — the SGA team having won the event in 1983 at Barquisimeto, Venezuela. The 1985 tournament was held at Valle Arriba Golf Club in Caracas, Venezuela.

The competition is based on the aggregate score of a team of two players for 72 holes. In addition, the individual winners are also recognized.

The team representing the Southern Golf Association (and the United States) consisted of Doug Farr from Monroe, Louisiana and Jay Sigel from Berwyn, Pennsylvania.

There were nineteen countries represented, including the Great Britain team of Peter Baker and Garth McGimpsey, both Walker Cup players, and many world class amateurs from Taiwan, Japan, Sweden and Italy who had competed in the last World Amateur Cup in Hong Kong.

Farr and Sigel won the aggregate 72 hole tournament with a score of 10 under par, which was 14 strokes ahead of second place Canada. Also, Farr and Sigel tied for low in the individual competition.

The tournament was nationally televised the last two days, and it was a very dramatic finish with Doug Farr rolling in a 25 foot putt from the fringe of the green to tie Jay Sigel for first place, in the individual standings, at 5 under par each, after Jay had lipped the cup with his second shot to the 18th green for a tap-in birdie.

## **DUKE DONAHUE WINS 1985 SOUTHERN JUNIOR AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP**

Shreveport, Louisiana — The Thirteenth Annual Southern Golf Association Junior Amateur Championship was held over the period June 11-13, 1985 at the Shreveport Country Club. The generous hospitality of the host club brought to mind fond memories of the SGA last visit to the Shreveport Country Club in 1964. It is always a pleasure to revisit friends who share the SGA interest in amateur golf and in keeping the integrity of amateurism.

As usual, the contestants represented various state junior champions and top players, along with the top finishers in numerous regional, national and special tournaments. The 1985 field had 123 contestants from twelve states, 25 in the 13-14 age division and 98 in the 15-17 age division.

The 1985 Southern Junior Amateur Championship was played on a course that is an outstanding layout in perfect condition playing a par 71 over 6300 yards. The competition consisted of 54 holes of stroke play.

The Champion for 1985 is seventeen year old Duke Donahue of Dayton, Ohio and Tuscaloosa, Alabama. Duke kept the pressure on the playing field with his three steady rounds of 74-74-71—219. Right with the champion all the way to the final hole was the runner-up, Christian Williams of Spartanburg, South Carolina, with rounds of 72-76-72—220. On the last hole of the championship, a par 4 hole 383 yards in length, Duke had a par 4 while Christian had to settle for a bogey 5, thus deciding the winner. The final results were close all the way to the finish with only five strokes between the winner and the fifth place contestant.

Christopher Cupit, Jr. of Atlanta, Georgia, finished in third place with rounds of 71-78-72—221. A great second round of 69 by Gerald Adams, Shreveport, Louisiana, enabled him to place fourth. Steven Spencer, Jr. of Augusta, GA finished fifth.

The 13-14 age division used the same tees as the older age division and they also displayed some outstanding golf and sportsmanship. The winner was Rett Crowder of Jackson, Mississippi, with three great rounds of 84-79-76—239. The runner-up was Jon Whittemore of Roanoke, Texas who had rounds of 81-80-83—244.

The State Team Championship, consisting of the four low players from the same state, was won by Louisiana with a total team score of 918 which was 7 strokes better than second place Tennessee with a total team score of 925. The Louisiana team members were Gerald Adams, Shreveport (223); Michael Black, New Orleans

(230); Perry Moss, Shreveport (232) and Todd Sherman, Baton Rouge (233).

The driving contest had its usual interest and participation even the landing area was soft and offered little or no roll. Nevertheless, Gerald Adams of Shreveport had the longest drive of 280 yards with Brad McMakin of Beaumont, Texas just shortly behind at 278 yards. In the 13-14 age division, Peyton Boddie of Shreveport had a great drive of 264 yards and was the winner.

It was a great experience for the junior players and they had the added opportunity and pleasure of hearing Terry Bradshaw speak at the Contestants' Dinner. After his inspiring message on having good manners, being dedicated, and displaying good sportsmanship at all times; Terry requested questions from the boys. Their appreciation and interest was displayed by the great number of questions they posed, and Terry is to be highly complimented for his patience and endurance to stay and answer these questions.

The membership of the Shreveport Country Club and its staff under Bobby Shields, Manager, gave unlimited support and hospitality. Martin Stuart, Golf Professional, and his staff were most helpful and their time and efforts are most appreciated. The golf course was in super condition all during the period of play and this was due to the hard work and dedication before and during the championship by Paul Atkins, Golf Course Superintendent, and his crew.

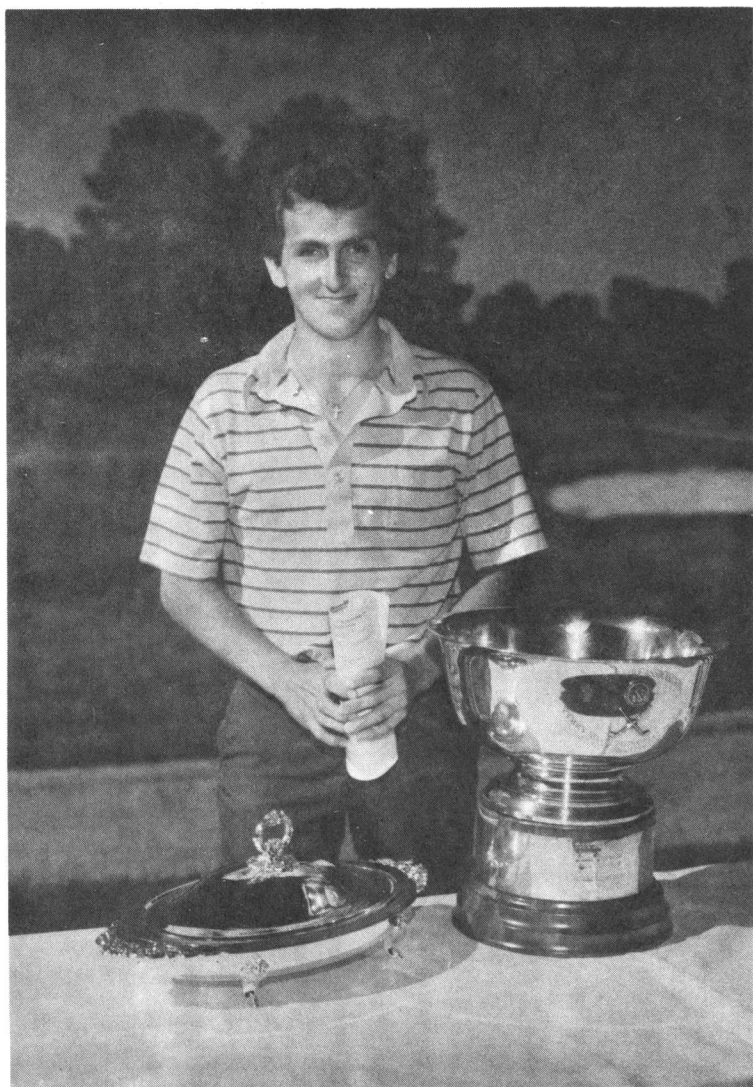

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF  
SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION  
(Approved 1975)**

I, the undersigned, a natural person of the age of twenty-one years or more, do hereby form a non-profit corporation under the laws of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Non-Profit Corporation Act," and the several amendments thereto, and to that end do hereby set forth:

**ARTICLE I  
NAME**

The name of the corporation is: SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

**ARTICLE II  
PERIOD OF DURATION**

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

**ARTICLE III  
PURPOSE**

The objects and purposes of the Association shall be to promote the game of golf, to protect the interests of its members, to hold such tournaments as may be decided upon by the Board of Directors, and to suitably recognize the winners in the Championship or other contests. The Association shall be empowered to engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of such exempt purposes specified in Section 501(c)(3).

**ARTICLE IV  
MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects and purposes of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. A regularly organized golf club is a club which is composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs and operate permanently at one golf course which they need not control. Upon the filing of these Articles of Incorporation, the initial membership shall consist of those clubs named on the Roster of Membership attached hereto.

**ARTICLE V  
DIRECTORS**

The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number, terms, qualifications and method of election of Directors shall be set forth in the bylaws.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be thirty-nine (39).

ARTICLE VI  
**REGISTERED OFFICE**

The address of the initial registered office of the Association is Suite 3500, ONE NCNB PLAZA, Charlotte, North Carolina 28280, and the address of the initial registered agent at such address is Richard E. Thigpen, Jr.

ARTICLE VII  
**NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION**

The Association is a non-profit organization, no part of the capital or net earnings of which shall inure to the benefit of any member or any private individual. Upon the dissolution of the Association, any assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations shall be distributed to the United States Golf Association provided it has retained its exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In the event the exempt status of the United States Golf Association has been revoked the assets of the Association shall be distributed to an organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which organization or organizations are not within the definition of a private foundation under Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code.

OF

**ARTICLE I**

**Membership**

**Section 1. Qualification for Membership.** Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. As used herein, "any regularly organized golf club" means a permanent golf club composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs through officers and committees whom they select. Such clubs shall operate permanently at one golf course which its members have the right to play but said club need not control the course where it plays.

**Section 2. Application for Membership.** Application for membership shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Association, in such form and accompanied by such information as the Secretary deems necessary for the Board of Directors to have before passing on such application. Dues for one (1) full year shall accompany the application.

**Section 3. Election to Membership.** Election to membership shall be by the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present at any regular or special meeting at which such application is considered.

**Section 4. Suspension or Expulsion of Members.** Except as provided in Section 5, below, a member may be suspended or expelled from the Association with or without cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Board of Directors present in person.

**Section 5. Dues.** The Board of Directors shall fix the annual dues, which shall be payable prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Members of the club whose dues are not paid by that time shall be barred from entering all Association events during the period of delinquency. Any member whose annual dues are unpaid for sixty days (60) days after the end of the fiscal year shall be automatically dropped from membership in the Association.

**ARTICLE II**

**Membership Meetings**

**Section 1. Annual Meeting.** The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held during the week and at the place of the annual Southern Championship Tournament, the exact day and hour to be fixed by the President of the Association. The Secretary of the Association shall give at least fourteen (14) days notice thereof to each member.

The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows:

1. Roll Call.
2. Minutes of Previous Meeting.
3. Secretary's Report.
4. Treasurer's Report.
5. Committee Reports.
6. President's Report.
7. Old and New Business.
8. Elections.
9. Adjournment.

## *Southern Golf Association*

**Section 2. Special Meetings.** A special meeting of the Association may be held on call of the President or by written request directed to the Secretary and signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, provided that at least ten (10) days written notice thereof is given to each member. Such notice shall contain a statement of the purposes of the subject meeting.

**Section 3. Representation.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association, each member shall have the right to be represented, but in person only, by one voting delegate or alternate.

**Section 4. Quorum.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association those representatives of members, present in person, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting.

### **ARTICLE III**

#### **Board of Directors**

**Section 1. General Powers and Duties.** The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

**Section 2. Number, Term, and Qualification.** The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President and a Vice President in charge of Senior Affairs and a Vice President in charge of Junior Affairs and not less than twenty-five (25) nor more than forty-five (45) other directors. All directors shall hold office through the next annual meeting of the Association or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. All members of the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of member club of the Association.

**Section 3. Election.** Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the member clubs by a vote of a majority of the voting delegates present in person. All vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by the remaining Directors, at any regular or special meeting, by the vote of the majority of the Directors in a meeting at which a quorum is present. The Director thus elected to fill any vacancy shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the members and until a successor is elected and qualified.

**Section 4. Meetings.** The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Association. In addition, special meetings may be called by or at the written request of the President or any three Directors. The person authorized by the Board to give notice of special meetings of the Board may designate the place, for the holding of any special meeting.

**Section 5. Notice.** Written notice of annual and special meetings of the Board shall be given to each Director at least ten (10) days in advance of said meeting. However, such notice may be waived as provided in these Bylaws. The business to be transacted at annual meetings need not be specified in the notice of such meetings, unless specifically required by law or by these Bylaws. Notice of a special meeting shall set forth the purpose for which the meeting is called.

**Section 6. Quorum.** Those Directors in attendance shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. Unless otherwise required by charter or statute, the act of a majority of the Directors present at any properly convened meeting at which there is a quorum shall be deemed the act of the Board.

**Section 7. Directors Emeritus.** At any annual meeting, the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present in person, may elect

Directors emeritus to serve for life and those so elected shall have seat and voice on the Board of Directors but no vote.

**Section 8. Associate Directors.** The President shall have the authority to appoint associate Directors for terms not to exceed one (1) year, and those so appointed shall have seat and voice but no vote.

**Section 9. Committees.** The Board of Directors may establish such standing or other committees as they consider proper or for the best interests of the Association and the membership of all such committees shall consist of those persons appointed by the President. The President of the Association shall ex-officio be a member of all committees.

**Section 10. Rules.** The Board of Directors shall make all rules governing the conduct and management of the Association which it deems advisable and which are not in conflict with the purpose of the Association or its Bylaws.

**Section 11. Compensation.** Directors shall receive no salary for their services.

#### **ARTICLE IV Waiver of Notice**

Whenever, under the laws of the State of North Carolina or by provision of these Bylaws, a waiver in writing is signed by persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, it shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

#### **ARTICLE V Officers**

**Section 1. Officers and Terms.** The officers of the Association shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Vice President for Senior Affairs, a Vice President for Junior Affairs, an Executive Secretary, a Field Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be elected by the Board of Directors. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be merged into the single office of Secretary-Treasurer at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office for one year or until his successor is elected and qualified.

**Section 2. Vacancies.** Vacancies in an office may be filled by the Directors at any regular or special meeting.

**Section 3. Election and Removal.** Any officer may be elected or removed without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors present in person at a regular or special meeting.

**Section 4. President.** The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board, shall be the chief executive officer of the Association, and shall have general supervision and management of the affairs of the Association subject, however, to the control, when exercised, of the Board of Directors. He shall make reports to the Directors and members and perform all such other duties as are incident to this office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors.

**Section 5. First Vice President.** The First Vice President shall perform all such duties as may be properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President and, in the absence or inability of the President, shall exercise and perform the functions and exercise all the powers of the President.

**Section 6. Second Vice President.** The Second Vice President, in the absence of the First Vice President, shall perform the duties of that office.

**Section 7. Vice President for Senior Affairs.** The Vice President for Senior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for seniors.

**Section 8. Vice President for Junior Affairs.** The Vice President for Junior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for juniors.

**Section 9. Executive Secretary.** The Executive Secretary shall: keep minutes of the meetings of the Directors and members; have charge of the books and records; receive and disburse all funds; provide the Treasurer with accounts of all transactions concerning the financial condition of the Association; receive and process all membership applications and entries for tournaments; be responsible for making arrangements for tournaments and assisting in the conduct of competitions; perform such other duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

**Section 10. Field Secretary.** The Field Secretary shall make such reports and perform such duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

**Section 11. Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall have custody of all monies and securities of the Association and shall keep regular books of account. He shall disburse the funds of the Association as may be ordered by the Board of Directors or the President, and shall render an account of all his transactions as Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Association, and shall perform all duties incident to his office or that are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sums and with such securities as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. He shall report in writing to the Board of Directors and the members of the Association at the meeting of each body.

**Section 12. Compensation.** The salaries, if any, of the employees and officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

## ARTICLE VI

### Annual Championship Tournament and Other Tournaments

**Section 1. Tournaments.** Each year a tournament for the Amateur Championship of the South shall be held under the direction and management of the Board of Directors, or such committees as they may designate, and suitable prizes shall be awarded in the championship. In addition, the Association shall conduct such other tournaments as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. The Board shall determine the method of play in such tournaments or delegate such power or any part thereof to any duly established committee.

**Section 2. Site.** The Board shall select the sites for all tournaments sponsored by the Association. The site of the succeeding years' championship shall be determined at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

**Section 3. Entry Fees.** The entry fee for the championship tournament and all other tournaments shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The entries shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors.

**Section 4. Eligibility.** No player shall be eligible to compete in a championship tournament unless (1) he is a bona fide member of a club belonging to the Association and in good standing, and has been a member of the club from which he is entered for sixty (60) days prior to the date of the championship competition unless said competitor shall be otherwise eligible by reason of his membership in some other club or (2) has competed within the calendar year of the tournament in which he is entered as a member of a golf team of a college or university located within one

of the states named in Article I, Section 1, which team represents said school in regularly scheduled intercollegiate golf competition or (3) has received an invitation from a special committee of former Southern Golf Association Presidents who shall have the right, but not the obligation, to invite one or more competitors of national or international standing who are not otherwise eligible to compete in the Southern Golf Association Championship. Any person who is proved, to the satisfaction of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting to have been guilty of fraudulent act or other discreditable conduct of any kind, may be declared by the Board of Directors to be ineligible to compete in any competition, suspended or expelled.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

##### **Rules of Tournaments**

All tournament competition shall be played strictly in accordance with the rules of golf approved by the United States Golf Association with such local rules as the Rules Committee of this Association may adopt or authorize. All other disputes shall be decided by the Tournament Committee, whose decision shall be final.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

##### **Disputes Between Member Clubs**

All complaints and disputes between member clubs of this Association shall be decided by the Board of Directors, excluding representatives of any member club involved in the dispute being considered.

#### **ARTICLE IX**

##### **Amendments**

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, amend and repeal the Bylaws of this Association by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Directors present at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Such action of the Board shall be subject to review by the members of the Association.

**RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association, since its founding in 1902, has conducted its affairs in such manner as to promote the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has sponsored championships which have produced players of regional, national, and international fame who have been a credit to the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has trained and provided administrators for the game of golf who have enhanced the game at all levels, both regional, national, and international; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has supported turf research, sponsored scholarships and by other means has made more meaningful and worthwhile the game of golf for all golfers; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association recognizes the international language of sports and particularly the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association desires to increase its support of golf on the international level and to promote, through the game of golf, better international relations and a better understanding among people around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Southern Golf Association does hereby endorse the development of a people-to-people relationship at the international level through the promotion of the game of golf and international, amateur competition to the end that international goodwill and understanding might be strengthened; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the officers of the Southern Golf Association are hereby authorized and directed to implement those programs deemed reasonable to achieve the objectives of this Association.
