Commemorating his career in Golf and the greatest record yet achieved in the competitive phases of the game, this trophy is dedicated to

ROBERT TYRE JONES, JR.

Who was reared in and played from Atlanta, Georgia, and who in the space of fifteen years, from 1916 through 1930, played in thirty-one major championships of the United States and Great Britain, and retired at the age of 28, with this list of victories:

UNITED STATES AMATEUR, 1924, 1925, 1927, 1928,
1930.

UNITED STATES OPEN, 1923, 1926, 1929, 1930.

BRITISH OPEN, 1926, 1927, 1930.

BRITISH AMATEUR, 1930.

Additionally, he won the first Georgia State Amateur Championship in 1916 at the age of 14; won the Southern Amateur Championship in 1917, 1920, and 1922; and played as a member of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1922, 1924, 1926, 1928 and 1930, being captain in the last two meetings, and never losing a match at singles.

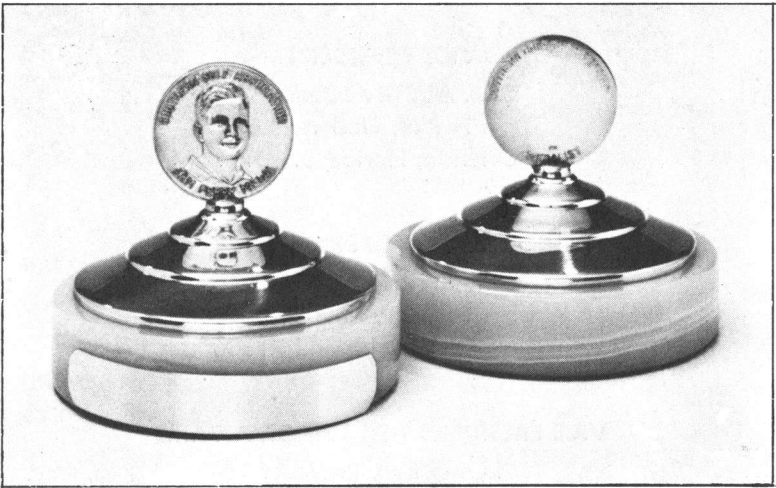
At his retirement from competitive Golf in 1930 his status as First Official World Champion was assured by his winning in that year the British Amateur, the British Open, the United States Open and the United States Amateur Championships, known as the Grand Slam, and thus entrenching his record safely and forever within the Impregnable Quadrilateral of Golf.

**ROB McNAMARA WINS
1986 SOUTHERN AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP**

Ooltewah, Tennessee—Rob McNamara of Frankfort, Kentucky was the winner of the 80th Annual Southern Amateur Championship. Play was conducted over The Honors Course in Ooltewah, Tennessee. This great course was designed by Pete Dye and the 1986 SGA Championship was the first major championship played on the course, but it is only a forerunner of many major championships to come including the US Amateur Championship scheduled for the Honors Course in 1990.

McNamara returned scores of 74-71-72-76—293, to gain the winner's spot by one stroke over Ed Pfister of Marilla, New York and a member of the Oklahoma State University golf team. Pfister's rounds were 73-76-74-71—294.

Third place was shared by two players, Peter Persons of Macon, Georgia and Bill McDonald of Dalton, Georgia at 295. Persons had rounds of 74-75-68-78 and McDonald's rounds were 72-73-76-74.

Fifth place was a tie among three players, Jim Vernon of Frankfort, Kentucky, Tom Musselman of Knoxville, Tennessee and Billie Andrade of Bristol, Rhode Island and Wake Forest University, with scores of 296. Alone in eighth place at 297 was Len Mattiace of Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida who was the winner of the 1985 Southern Amateur Championship. Tied for ninth place were Doug Farr of Monroe, Louisiana and Michael Bradley of Valrico, Florida at 298.

During the first round of play, 9 players shot par or better, led by Tad Rhyan, University of Tennessee senior from Sarasota, Florida with a fine 3 under par 69. After completion of 36 holes, Rhyan at 143, 1 under par, maintained a 2 stroke lead and also won the Sam Perry Medalist Trophy. At this point 3 other collegians were bunched at 145, 1 over par. They were Georgia Tech's Bill McDonald, LSU senior Rob McNamara and Len Mattiace, who had just completed his freshman year as a member of Wake Forest University's NCAA Championship Team.

After the third round our new leader, by one stroke, was Billie Andrade, the nation's hottest amateur with wins in the North & South and the Sunnehanna and Captain of the Wake Forest University golf team. Close in the chase were McNamara and Persons only 1 behind, and Brian Watts, winner of the Trans-Miss Amateur the previous week, was just 2 shots behind.

The fourth and final round of the competition produced the winner McNamara, but not before a series of events that left the players and spectators alike in a near state of frenzy.

Andrade lost his 1 shot lead over McNamara in a three-hole nightmarish stretch from 5 through 7 with a bogey-bogey-triple bogey and never seriously contended again.

Peter Persons, two times All American from Georgia and runner-in the 1986 US Amateur had played the front side in 1 under par to take a 2 shot advantage over McNamara going to the back side. However, during the last seven holes, Persons' concentration failed and over that stretch he was 7 over par, taking himself out of contention.

Oklahoma State golfer Ed Pfister was playing ahead of the leaders, and he finished with a 1 under par 71, one of only 4 sub-par rounds on the final day of play, and 1 of only 14 for the tournament. Pfister waited patiently in the wings for the others to finish and he ended up in sole possession of second place.

McNamara didn't handle the stretch holes with distinction, himself. However, he was able to maintain the lead he attained with his brilliant play over holes 10, 11 and 12 with three consecutive birdies, and he emerged as the 1986 Champion by 1 stroke.

McNamara's composure and ability to concentrate, while the ball appeared to be "bouncing the wrong way", won out. The consensus of all players was that although McNamara won the tournament, the ultimate winner was the golf course.

The Bob Jones Trophy is awarded annually to the low team of four players from the same state, based on the first 36 holes of play. Georgia and Florida were tied after the first 36 holes, and the winner was decided by a playoff in the 3rd round which was won by Georgia. Their team score for 36 holes was 591 based on the performance of Bill McDonald, Dalton (145); Jonathan Nichols, Savannah (148); Peter Persons, Macon (149) and Seth Knight, Atlanta (149).

The Honors Course is truly a magnificent layout and a great test of golf. Although there is no question that it is a very difficult course, the excellent playing conditions presented a delightful and interesting challenge to an unusually talented field of golfers. This Championship will long be remembered as the first major event, and over a period of time the Honors Course will receive the recognition it rightly deserves.

The cooperation and assistance received from Club Manager Doris Fulghum and her staff; Golf Professional Mike Fiddelke and his staff and Golf Course Superintendent David Stone and his staff were outstanding and contributed immeasurably to the resounding success of the 1986 Southern Golf Association Championship.

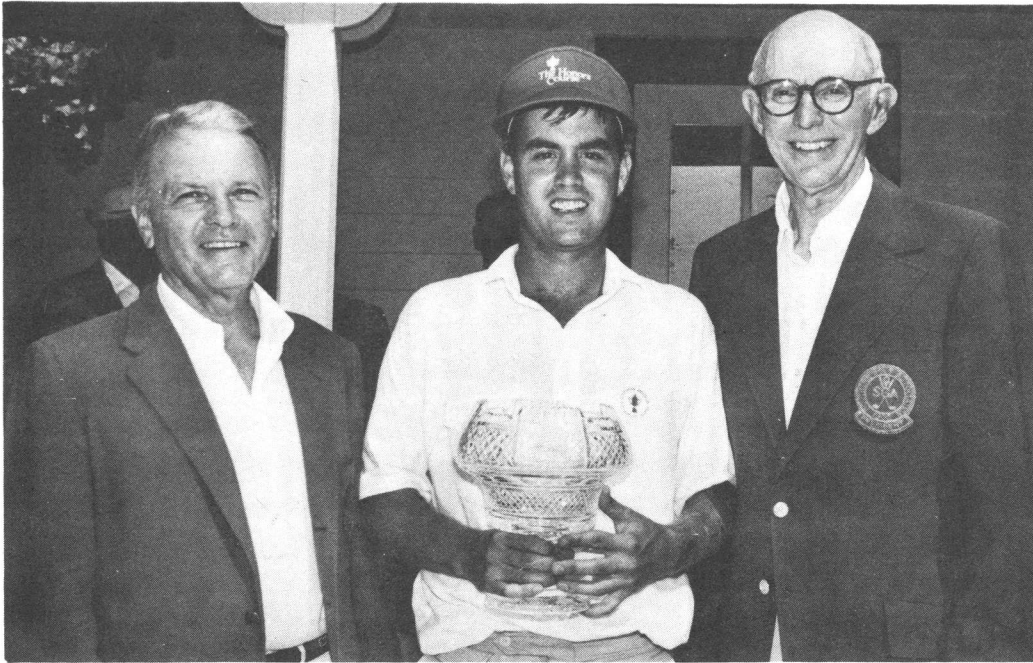

**MICHAEL CLARK WINS 1986 SOUTHERN JUNIOR
AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP**

Tuscaloosa, Alabama — The Fourteenth Annual Southern Golf Association Junior Amateur Championship was held over the period June 10-12, 1986 at the NorthRiver Yacht Club, situated on beautiful Lake Tuscaloosa. This makes our second Championship held at the gracious and beautiful NorthRiver Facility with its outstanding golf course. Again, as in 1981, the SGA and the contestants, were privileged to be at a site where its facilities and staff are dedicated to amateur golf.

The golf course was in perfect playing condition with its immaculate turf and manicuring. The competition consisted of 54 holes of stroke play over 6500 yards playing at a par of 71.

The field consisted of 161 contestants from eight states representing various state junior champions and other top low handicap players, along with top finishers in numerous regional, national, and special tournaments. The field was divided into two age groups. There were 26 contestants in the 13-14 age division and 135 in the 15-17 age division.

The Champion for 1986 is seventeen year old Michael Clark of Dalton, Georgia. Michael had a very fine opening round of 67 — 4 under par, which was the low round of the Championship — followed by a second round 76 and a final round 73, for a total of 216, giving him a four shot winning margin.

Jimmy Johnston from Knoxville, Tennessee was second place winner with 220 total, and right behind at 221 was Doug Barron of Memphis, Tennessee in third place. The last round was most exciting for spectators as the above three contestants at the end of the second round were at 143, 144 and 142, respectively. Michael's fine finishing round 73 gave him his margin of victory.

As the 1986 Southern Junior Amateur Champion, Michael was eligible to play in the 1986 Southern Amateur Championship the following month at The Honors Course in Ooltewah, Tennessee. His performance there against the field of well known amateurs from throughout the United States was very impressive. Michael made the 36 hole cut for the low 72 players and we look for continued success for him in his future golfing endeavors.

The 13-14 age division used the same tees as the older age division and they too displayed some outstanding golf and sportsmanship. The winner was Mike Dreier of Knoxville, Tennessee, with rounds of 83-84-77 for a 244 total. Right behind in second place was Trey Sones, Atlanta, Georgia with rounds of 76-88-81 for a 245 total. A great final round enabled the winner to hold off his competitors.

The State Team Championship, consisting of the four low players from the same state after 36 holes of play was won by Tennessee with a total team score of 585. The Tennessee team members were Doug Barron, Memphis (142); Jimmy Johnston, Knoxville (144); Bowen Sargent, Brentwood (149); and a tie for the fourth member at (150), Donnie Cooper, Knoxville and Chris Dibble, Greenville.

The driving contest had its usual interest and participation. The winner was a repeat from 1985, Gerald Adams of Shreveport, Louisiana, with a drive of 277 yards. Jeff Smith of McComb, Mississippi was right behind at 276 yards. In the 13-14 age division, Dan Stone of St. Petersburg, Florida, was the winner with a 264 yard drive.

The Championship was a great occasion for the junior players and they had the added experience and pleasure of having a clinic presented by Charley Boswell, winner of 17 National and 11 International Blind Golf Championships. Mr. Boswell also gave an inspiring message after the Contestants' Dinner on the "truths" of success for all aspects of our lives.

The membership of NorthRiver Yacht Club and its staff under Hank Johnson gave unlimited support and hospitality. Scott Davenport, Golf Professional, and his entire staff were always cooperative and helpful. All the time and efforts of the NorthRiver staff is most appreciated by the SGA and all of the contestants. The excellent condition of the course was due to the hard work of the Superintendent John Mann, and his crew.

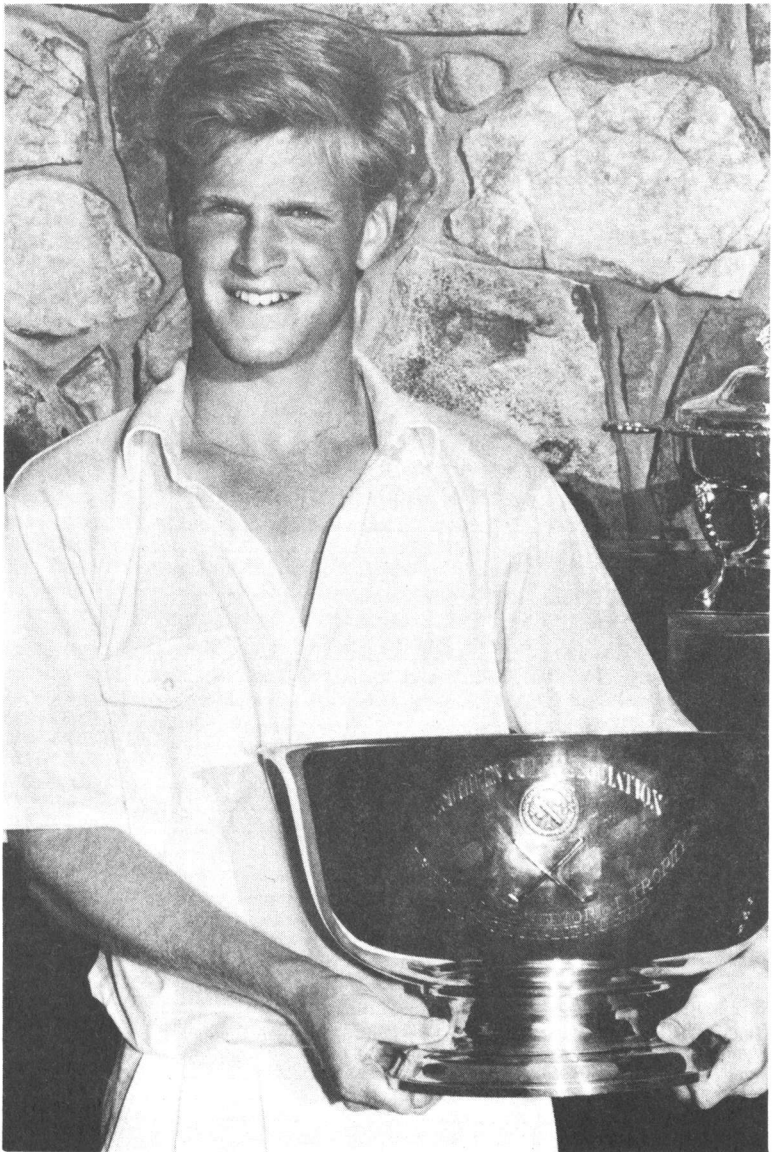

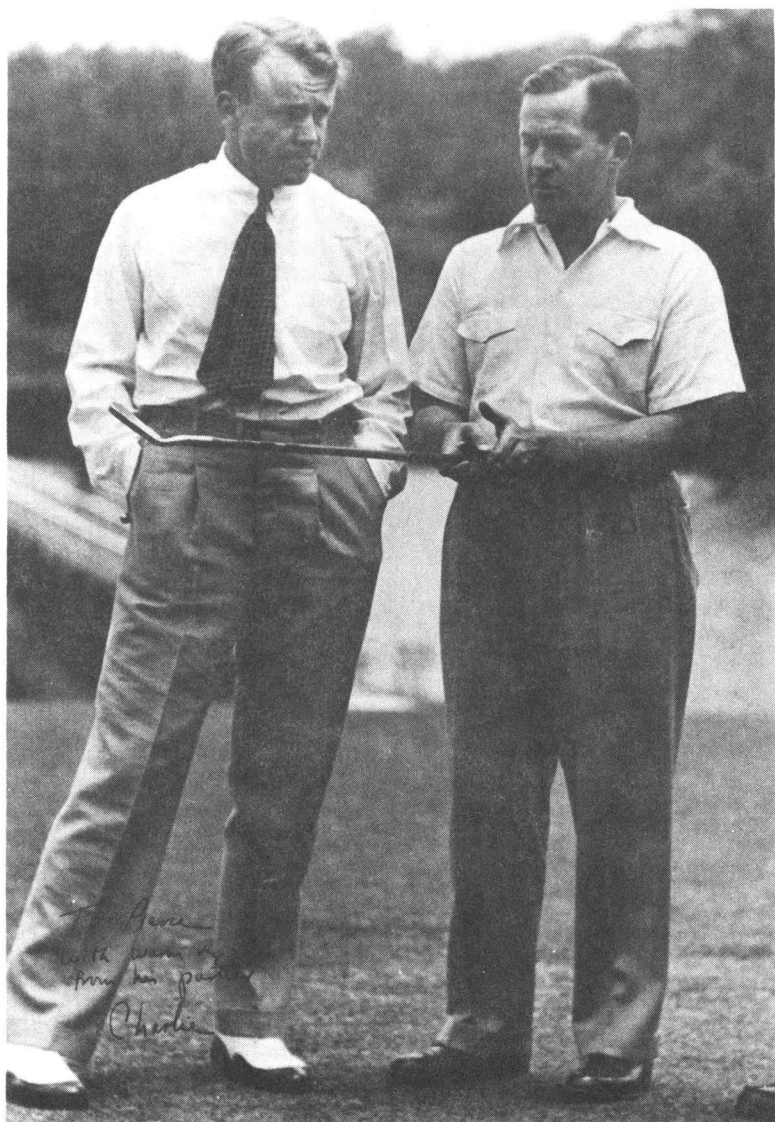

It was with great pleasure that the Board of Directors of the Southern Golf Association inducted Charles R. Yates of Atlanta into our Southern Golf Association Hall of Fame during the Southern Amateur Championship held at The Honors Course at Ooltewah, Tennessee in July 1986. Charles Yates' involvement with the Southern Golf Association began as a competitor in several Southern Amateur Championships, being medalist and finalist in the 1937 Championship at the Charlotte Country Club. He and Dick Garlington of Georgia also won the 4-Ball Championship held that year. Charles was also a winner of the 4-Ball Championship with partner Julius Hughes of Georgia, in 1938, at Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida.

In regards to his competitive record on a state, national and international level, he was Georgia State Champion in 1931 and 1932; National Intercollegiate Golf Champion in 1934 and 1935, and also Western Amateur Champion in 1935. He won the British Amateur Championship in 1938 and played on the 1936 and 1938 U. S. Walker Cup Teams. He was non-playing Captain of the Walker Cup Team in 1953 and in 1971 was the principal speaker at the 50th Anniversary Jubilee Dinner of the Walker Cup at St. Andrews, Scotland. Charles Yates was the recipient of the Bob Jones Award of the United States Golf Association in 1980.

In regards to his administrative ability, he was a Director of the Southern Golf Association in 1946 and 1947. He is secretary of the Augusta National Golf Club and has contributed much to golf through promotion of The Masters Tournament.

In addition to his golfing honors, he has been an outstanding citizen in Atlanta. His honors include the Presidency of the Atlanta Arts Alliance, 1973-1983; President of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, 1962-1965; Past President and Director of the Georgia Chamber of Commerce; Chairman of the Rotary Club of Atlanta; President of the Georgia Tech Alumni Association, 1952-1953; and President of the Georgia Tech Foundation Inc., 1975-1977. He was presented, in 1984, the Alumni Distinguished Service Award from Georgia Tech.

The Southern Golf Association is proud to have such an outstanding combination of golfer and civic leader as Charles Yates as a member of its Hall of Fame. His golfing sportsmanship demonstrates the personal quality of fair play, self control and self denial. It was said of Charles Yates, when he received the USGA 1980 Bob Jones Award, "Charles Yates has approached golf in much the same spirit that Bob Jones did — as a great game in itself, but also a game that can lead to life-long friendships. In his own way, Charlie has become an institution on both sides of the Atlantic."

In 1985, a new award, the Award of Merit, was established to recognize outstanding national or international golfing accomplishments by Directors of the Southern Golf Association.

In 1986, Awards of Merit of the Southern Golf Association were given to Director Lewis W. Oehmig, winner of the 1985 USGA Men's Senior Amateur Championship, and to Director Dale Morey, winner of the 1985 British Senior Open Amateur Championship.

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION
(Approved 1975)**

I, the undersigned, a natural person of the age of twenty-one years or more, do hereby form a non-profit corporation under the laws of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Non-Profit Corporation Act," and the several amendments thereto, and to that end do hereby set forth:

**ARTICLE I
NAME**

The name of the corporation is: SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION

**ARTICLE II
PERIOD OF DURATION**

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

**ARTICLE III
PURPOSE**

The objects and purposes of the Association shall be to promote the game of golf, to protect the interests of its members, to hold such tournaments as may be decided upon by the Board of Directors, and to suitably recognize the winners in the Championship or other contests. The Association shall be empowered to engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of such exempt purposes specified in Section 501(c)(3).

**ARTICLE IV
MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects and purposes of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. A regularly organized golf club is a club which is composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs and operate permanently at one golf course which they need not control. Upon the filing of these Articles of Incorporation, the initial membership shall consist of those clubs named on the Roster of Membership attached hereto.

**ARTICLE V
DIRECTORS**

The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number, terms, qualifications and method of election of Directors shall be set forth in the bylaws.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be thirty-nine (39).

ARTICLE VI REGISTERED OFFICE

The address of the initial registered office of the Association is Suite 3500, ONE NCNB PLAZA, Charlotte, North Carolina 28280, and the address of the initial registered agent at such address is Richard E. Thigpen, Jr.

ARTICLE VII NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

The Association is a non-profit organization, no part of the capital or net earnings of which shall inure to the benefit of any member or any private individual. Upon the dissolution of the Association, any assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations shall be distributed to the United States Golf Association provided it has retained its exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In the event the exempt status of the United States Golf Association has been revoked the assets of the Association shall be distributed to an organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which organization or organizations are not within the definition of a private foundation under Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code.

**BYLAWS
OF
SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION**

ARTICLE I

Membership

Section 1. Qualification for Membership. Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. As used herein, "any regularly organized golf club" means a permanent golf club composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs through officers and committees whom they select. Such clubs shall operate permanently at one golf course which its members have the right to play but said club need not control the course where it plays.

Section 2. Application for Membership. Application for membership shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Association, in such form and accompanied by such information as the Secretary deems necessary for the Board of Directors to have before passing on such application. Dues for one (1) full year shall accompany the application.

Section 3. Election to Membership. Election to membership shall be by the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present at any regular or special meeting at which such application is considered.

Section 4. Suspension or Expulsion of Members. Except as provided in Section 5, below, a member may be suspended or expelled from the Association with or without cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Board of Directors present in person.

Section 5. Dues. The Board of Directors shall fix the annual dues, which shall be payable prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Members of the club whose dues are not paid by that time shall be barred from entering all Association events during the period of delinquency. Any member whose annual dues are unpaid for sixty days (60) days after the end of the fiscal year shall be automatically dropped from membership in the Association.

ARTICLE II

Membership Meetings

Section 1. Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held during the week and at the place of the annual Southern Championship Tournament, the exact day and hour to be fixed by the President of the Association. The Secretary of the Association shall give at least fourteen (14) days notice thereof to each member.

The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows:

1. Roll Call.
2. Minutes of Previous Meeting.
3. Secretary's Report.
4. Treasurer's Report.
5. Committee Reports.
6. President's Report.
7. Old and New Business.
8. Elections.
9. Adjournment.

Section 2. Special Meetings. A special meeting of the Association may be held on call of the President or by written request directed to the Secretary and signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, provided that at least ten (10) days written notice thereof is given to each member. Such notice shall contain a statement of the purposes of the subject meeting.

Section 3. Representation. At any regular or special meeting of the Association, each member shall have the right to be represented, but in person only, by one voting delegate or alternate.

Section 4. Quorum. At any regular or special meeting of the Association those representatives of members, present in person, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting.

ARTICLE III Board of Directors

Section 1. General Powers and Duties. The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Number, Term, and Qualification. The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President and a Vice President in charge of Senior Affairs and a Vice President in charge of Junior Affairs and not less than twenty-five (25) nor more than forty-five (45) other directors. All directors shall hold office through the next annual meeting of the Association or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. All members of the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of member club of the Association.

Section 3. Election. Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the member clubs by a vote of a majority of the voting delegates present in person. All vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by the remaining Directors, at any regular or special meeting, by the vote of the majority of the Directors in a meeting at which a quorum is present. The Director thus elected to fill any vacancy shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the members and until a successor is elected and qualified.

Section 4. Meetings. The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Association. In addition, special meetings may be called by or at the written request of the President or any three Directors. The person authorized by the Board to give notice of special meetings of the Board may designate the place, for the holding of any special meeting.

Section 5. Notice. Written notice of annual and special meetings of the Board shall be given to each Director at least ten (10) days in advance of said meeting. However, such notice may be waived as provided in these Bylaws. The business to be transacted at annual meetings need not be specified in the notice of such meetings, unless specifically required by law or by these Bylaws. Notice of a special meeting shall set forth the purpose for which the meeting is called.

Section 6. Quorum. Those Directors in attendance shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. Unless otherwise required by charter or statute, the act of a majority of the Directors present at any properly convened meeting at which there is a quorum shall be deemed the act of the Board.

Section 7. Directors Emeritus. At any annual meeting, the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present in person, may elect

Directors emeritus to serve for life and those so elected shall have seat and voice on the Board of Directors but no vote.

Section 8. Associate Directors. The President shall have the authority to appoint associate Directors for terms not to exceed one (1) year, and those so appointed shall have seat and voice but no vote.

Section 9. Committees. The Board of Directors may establish such standing or other committees as they consider proper or for the best interests of the Association and the membership of all such committees shall consist of those persons appointed by the President. The President of the Association shall ex-officio be a member of all committees.

Section 10. Rules. The Board of Directors shall make all rules governing the conduct and management of the Association which it deems advisable and which are not in conflict with the purpose of the Association or its Bylaws.

Section 11. Compensation. Directors shall receive no salary for their services.

ARTICLE IV Waiver of Notice

Whenever, under the laws of the State of North Carolina or by provision of these Bylaws, a waiver in writing is signed by persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, it shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

ARTICLE V Officers

Section 1. Officers and Terms. The officers of the Association shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Vice President for Senior Affairs, a Vice President for Junior Affairs, an Executive Secretary, a Field Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be elected by the Board of Directors. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be merged into the single office of Secretary-Treasurer at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office for one year or until his successor is elected and qualified.

Section 2. Vacancies. Vacancies in an office may be filled by the Directors at any regular or special meeting.

Section 3. Election and Removal. Any officer may be elected or removed without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors present in person at a regular or special meeting.

Section 4. President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board, shall be the chief executive officer of the Association, and shall have general supervision and management of the affairs of the Association subject, however, to the control, when exercised, of the Board of Directors. He shall make reports to the Directors and members and perform all such other duties as are incident to this office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. First Vice President. The First Vice President shall perform all such duties as may be properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President and, in the absence or inability of the President, shall exercise and perform the functions and exercise all the powers of the President.

Section 6. Second Vice President. The Second Vice President, in the absence of the First Vice President, shall perform the duties of that office.

Section 7. Vice President for Senior Affairs. The Vice President for Senior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for seniors.

Section 8. **Vice President for Junior Affairs.** The Vice President for Junior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for juniors.

Section 9. **Executive Secretary.** The Executive Secretary shall: keep minutes of the meetings of the Directors and members; have charge of the books and records; receive and disburse all funds; provide the Treasurer with accounts of all transactions concerning the financial condition of the Association; receive and process all membership applications and entries for tournaments; be responsible for making arrangements for tournaments and assisting in the conduct of competitions; perform such other duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

Section 10. **Field Secretary.** The Field Secretary shall make such reports and perform such duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

Section 11. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall have custody of all monies and securities of the Association and shall keep regular books of account. He shall disburse the funds of the Association as may be ordered by the Board of Directors or the President, and shall render an account of all his transactions as Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Association, and shall perform all duties incident to his office or that are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sums and with such securities as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. He shall report in writing to the Board of Directors and the members of the Association at the meeting of each body.

Section 12. **Compensation.** The salaries, if any, of the employees and officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI

Annual Championship Tournament and Other Tournaments

Section 1. **Tournaments.** Each year a tournament for the Amateur Championship of the South shall be held under the direction and management of the Board of Directors, or such committees as they may designate, and suitable prizes shall be awarded in the championship. In addition, the Association shall conduct such other tournaments as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. The Board shall determine the method of play in such tournaments or delegate such power or any part thereof to any duly established committee.

Section 2. **Site.** The Board shall select the sites for all tournaments sponsored by the Association. The site of the succeeding years' championship shall be determined at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. **Entry Fees.** The entry fee for the championship tournament and all other tournaments shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The entries shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. **Eligibility.** No player shall be eligible to compete in a championship tournament unless (1) he is a bona fide member of a club belonging to the Association and in good standing, and has been a member of the club from which he is entered for sixty (60) days prior to the date of the championship competition unless said competitor shall be otherwise eligible by reason of his membership in some other club or (2) has competed within the calendar year of the tournament in which he is entered as a member of a golf team of a college or university located within one

of the states named in Article I, Section 1, which team represents said school in regularly scheduled intercollegiate golf competition or (3) has received an invitation from a special committee of former Southern Golf Association Presidents who shall have the right, but not the obligation, to invite one or more competitors of national or international standing who are not otherwise eligible to compete in the Southern Golf Association Championship. Any person who is proved, to the satisfaction of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting to have been guilty of fraudulent act or other discreditable conduct of any kind, may be declared by the Board of Directors to be ineligible to compete in any competition, suspended or expelled.

ARTICLE VII

Rules of Tournaments

All tournament competition shall be played strictly in accordance with the rules of golf approved by the United States Golf Association with such local rules as the Rules Committee of this Association may adopt or authorize. All other disputes shall be decided by the Tournament Committee, whose decision shall be final.

ARTICLE VIII

Disputes Between Member Clubs

All complaints and disputes between member clubs of this Association shall be decided by the Board of Directors, excluding representatives of any member club involved in the dispute being considered.

ARTICLE IX

Amendments

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, amend and repeal the Bylaws of this Association by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Directors present at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Such action of the Board shall be subject to review by the members of the Association.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association, since its founding in 1902, has conducted its affairs in such manner as to promote the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has sponsored championships which have produced players of regional, national, and international fame who have been a credit to the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has trained and provided administrators for the game of golf who have enhanced the game at all levels, both regional, national, and international; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association has supported turf research, sponsored scholarships and by other means has made more meaningful and worthwhile the game of golf for all golfers; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association recognizes the international language of sports and particularly the game of golf; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Golf Association desires to increase its support of golf on the international level and to promote, through the game of golf, better international relations and a better understanding among people around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Southern Golf Association does hereby endorse the development of a people-to-people relationship at the international level through the promotion of the game of golf and international, amateur competition to the end that international goodwill and understanding might be strengthened; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the officers of the Southern Golf Association are hereby authorized and directed to implement those programs deemed reasonable to achieve the objectives of this Association.
