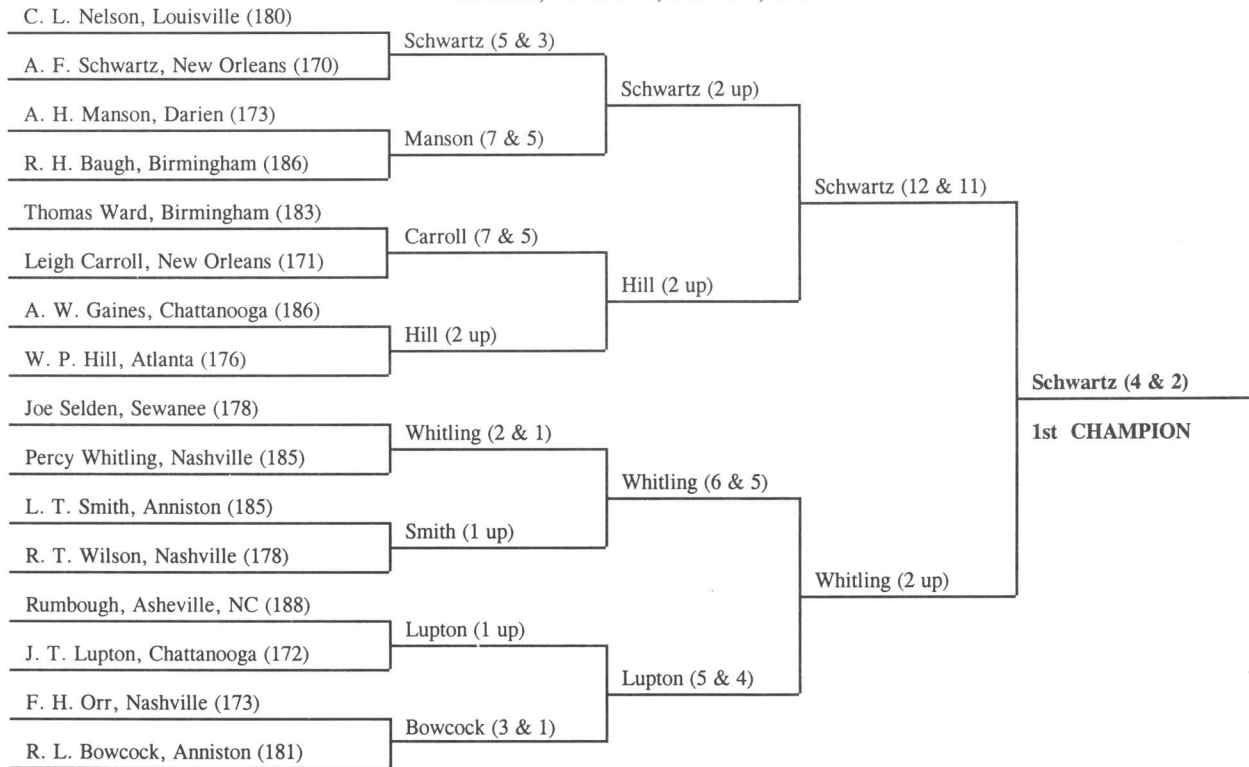

## **Loar Prevails at Ocean Forest for Amateur Championship**

Sea Island, GA — It was quite a week for the Loar family of Rockwall, Texas.

On Saturday, July 17, Edward Loar, 21, a rising senior at Oklahoma State University, won the 93<sup>rd</sup> annual Southern Amateur Championship at Ocean Forest Golf Club, a title that had slipped away from him the previous two years.

A day earlier, brother Nicholas, two years older, had advanced to the semifinals of the U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship at Spencer T. Olin Golf Club in Alton, Ill.

Edward Loar birdied the final hole on the 7,017 yard course at Ocean Forest to edge Matthew Saglio of Clearwater, Fla., by a stroke, 281 - 282.

Loar had begun the final round three strokes ahead of Saglio and Chris Morris of Tyler, Texas. Loar led Saglio by four after eight holes, trailed by two after 13, then pulled even on the 17<sup>th</sup>.

At the par 4 18<sup>th</sup>, Loar hit driver and 7 iron to the green and sank a 27 foot putt from right of the hole for the victory that ended two years of disappointment. Saglio had chipped his third shot from short of the green to within tap-in range for par but could only watch as Loar won the title.

"That putt was awesome," Loar acknowledged later. "I know I was choking like a dog on the back nine but inside I felt comfortable. I didn't get upset after all those bogies. I just tried to keep playing."

Still up by four after turning in 35, Loar started the back nine with a double bogey and three bogies to card 39-74 coming in. Saglio had 36-36--72 with four birdies, two bogies and a double bogey at the par 3 17<sup>th</sup>.

"I played well except for one bad swing," when he blocked a 5 wood tee shot into a greenside bunker at 17, Saglio said.

Loar won the Sunnehanna Amateur in June. Saglio was the medalist as Florida Southern College earned the NCAA Division II title in May.

Loar tied for the halfway lead in the Southern Amateur two years ago at Mira Vista in Fort Worth, Texas, before finishing fifth. Last year at the Country Club of Birmingham in Alabama, he led after two and three rounds but shot 73 the last day then lost on the second hole of a playoff.

Jothan Byrd of Columbia, S.C., was third with a 69-283 while Justin Bolli of Roswell, GA., shot a competitive course record with 66 the final round and tied for fifth at 286.

Defending champion Kris Maffet of Elizabethtown, Ky., was among four first round co-leaders, but faded to 295, 23<sup>rd</sup> among 168 starters. Also at 68 were Loar.

Brad Golden of Oklahoma City, Okla., and Michael Morrison of Signal Mountain, Tenn. Loar was the solo leader after 36 and 54 holes.

The 36 hole cut fell at seven over par 151. The top 40 and ties, or scores through 301, will be exempt from qualifying for the 94<sup>th</sup> Southern Amateur July 19-22, 2000, at the Atlanta Athletic Club in Duluth, Ga.

Play was suspended by rain and lightning on three of the four days for a total of more than seven hours.

On the eve of the Southern Amateur, Tim Jackson of Germantown, Tenn., was inducted into the Southern Golf Association Hall of Fame. He was the 1994 U.S. Mid-Amateur champion, and in 1998 won the North and South Amateur and Bob Jones Invitational and was a member of the USGA State Team Championship squad from Tennessee. Jackson played on the Walker Cup and Simon<sup>3</sup> Bolivar Cup teams in 1995. He has won six Memphis City and two Tennessee State Amateur Titles.

Because of the venue, the field included seven former and current Walker Cup players, including special invitees Joyhn Harris of Minneapolis, Minn., and Buddy Marucci of Berwyn, Pa. The others were Duke Delcher, Bluffton, S.C.; David Eger, Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla.; Tom McKnight, Galax, Va.; Steve Scott, Coral Springs, Fla.; and Jackson. Ocean Forest will host the Walker Cup in 2001.

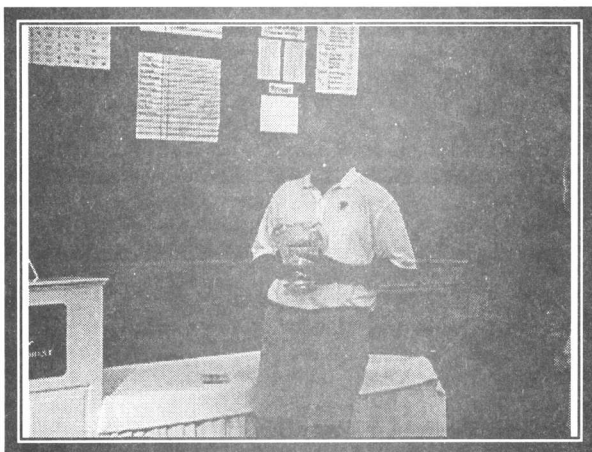

Additionally, he won the first Georgia State Amateur Championship in 1916 at the age of 14; won the Southern Amateur Championship in 1917, 1920, and 1922; and played as a member of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1922, 1924, 1926, 1928 and 1930, being captain in the last two meetings, and never losing a match at singles.

At his retirement from competitive Golf in 1930 his status as First Official World Champion was assured by his winning in that year the British Amateur, the British Open, the United States Open and the United States Amateur Championships, known as the Grand Slam, and thus entrenching his record safely and forever within the Impregnable Quadrilateral of Golf.

By action of the Board of Directors of the Southern Golf Association in 1949, the play of this tournament was indefinitely suspended and the championship trophy temporarily retired to East Lake Country Club, Atlanta, Georgia, the home club of Bobby Jones.

In 1951, the SGA instituted a form of competition within the Southern Amateur Championship, called the BOB JONES FOUR BALL TEAM COMPETITION, in which players represent their state. All players are eligible, and the winning team is comprised of the four players from a particular state who post the lowest four man score at the time of the cut. Each player is awarded the plaque shown on the previous two pages.

## **Barbosa Captures Rain Shortened Junior Championship**

St. Petersburg's Michael Barbosa then canned a 35 foot birdie putt on the 5<sup>th</sup> hole of sudden death to capture the title over Rand Williams of Raleigh, North Carolina and Brent Delahoussaye of Greer, South Carolina.

Mother Nature decided early on to establish dominance as she sent down torrential rains that halted starting times around mid-morning of the first day. Play was never re-started and the day was cast aside as no players finished 18 holes and very few even made the turn.

Delahoussaye, a senior-to-be at Riverside High School in Greer, South Carolina, set the early pace by posting a splendid 3 under 69 on the soggy, but resplendent, Surf Golf and Beach Club course. He carded one bogey against three birdies and five pars on the front side to turn at 32 and then proceeded to hold things together with a birdie and a bunch of pars on the back to come in with 35 for his early lead.

Trouble was lurking, however, five groups back in the form of Ward Marslender of Raleigh, North Carolina, who closed his round fast with three birdies on the back nine. Coupled with a one under 35 on the front, his total of 68 headed the leader board at the end of the day and set him up for a good run at the Championship.

One stroke behind Marslender, and two off the lead, was Dothan, Alabama youngster Heath West. Barbosa and Williams, along with defending champion Sean O'Hair of Bradenton, Florida were all in at 71. With nine players bunched within four strokes of one another, day two had the makings of a great shoot-out, and none were disappointed.

First round leader Marslender never managed to get anything going and posted a disappointing second round score of 76 to finish in a four way tie at 144, even par. The action, however, centered around Williams, Delahoussaye and Barbosa as they fought their way around the lush Surf Golf and Beach Club with no player ever gaining a decided advantage and finishing in a dead heat at 3 under 141.

All three players then marched off to the 1<sup>st</sup> hole to begin what would turn out to be a five hole sudden death shootout. The first three holes proved uneventful as all players parred their way through that point. Delahoussaye became the first victim with a bogey on the fourth hole and dropped out of play. Both Barbosa and Williams were on the green in regulation on the par five 5<sup>th</sup> hole - Williams with a 20 foot putt for birdie and Barbosa staring down a lengthy 35 footer. Barbosa makes - Williams misses and the Perry Adair Memorial Trophy heads to St. Petersburg.

## SGA HALL OF FAME

The Southern Golf Association Hall of Fame was established in 1972 by the Board of Directors of the Southern Golf Association. The following qualifications were established as criteria for nomination of an inductee, but an inductee does not have to meet every single criteria. The first Hall of Fame inductee was appropriately Robert Tyre Jones, Jr. The award was made posthumously in July, 1972 at the 1972 Southern Amateur Championship held at the Green Island Country Club in Columbus, Georgia.

In 1999, at Ocean Forest Golf Club in Sea Island, Georgia, **Tim Jackson** of Germantown, Tennessee was inducted into the Southern Golf Association Hall of Fame. In this, its 27th year, there have been 16 inductees with 11 years of no induction. This, in effect, makes it even more of an honor to be a member of the Southern Golf Association Hall of Fame.

**SIMON BOLIVAR CUP**

**SGA Sponsored United States Team Wins Bolivar Cup**

Maracaibo, Venezuela — Captained by John McKey of Stuart, Florida, President of the Southern Golf Association, the USA team of David Eger and Danny Green easily outdistanced the remaining field to capture the XVI Simon' Bolivar Cup match. Eger, of Ponte Vedre Beach, Florida posted a record breaking 72 hole score of 263 which, when coupled with Jackson, Tennessee native Green's 282 established the all time team record.

Each day raised the record bar as Eger and Green posted a 3 under 141 in the opening stanza, followed by a 9 under 135 on Friday for a 36 hole total of 276 (-12), a 5 under 139 on Saturday for a 54 hole total of 415 (-17), and, saving the best for last, a 14 under 130 in the final round for a 72 hole total of 545 (-17).

Individually, Eger was on a tear. Opening with a 4 under 68, he quickly followed that with a 8 under 64, cooled a little on Saturday by posting a 3 under 69, but then blew the field away with a closing, record breaking 10 under 62. His 72 hole total of 263 (-25) set a standard that might stand for a long time.

Forty-eight golfers from twenty-four countries converged on the Maracaibo Country Club in Maracaibo, Venezuela early in October to dispute possession of the XVI Simon' Bolivar Cup, and as has been the case in six out of the eight previous times the Cup has been contested and the US has fielded a team, the USA again claimed the top prize and the cup.

Although the United States won comfortably, the first two days of the event were extremely close as the Scottish team of David Patrick and Craig Heap opened with a team score of two under 142, only one stroke behind the Americans. Day two saw the Scots again post a score one stroke behind the 135 total carded by the American team, keeping it close at only two strokes behind Eger and Green.

The US continued their steady play on the third day, turning in a team 139 while the boys from Scotland slipped a bit to 144 but maintained second place by a shot over Canada, whose second round 135 matched the US for low round of the day, but could do no better than a 1 under 143 on the third. The US lead was now seven strokes, which in team play is not a very big margin. Day four and the cup belonged to the US as Eger stunned the field with his final round 62 while partner Green was making his mark with a neat 68, for a team total of 130, or 14 strokes under par. Scotland did finish in second, a distant 20 strokes behind the U.S., posting a final day 143 and a team total of 565, one ahead of the Canadians.

The Simon Bolivar Cup was inaugurated by the Venezuelan Golf Federation to provide an outstanding contest of golf and to establish bonds between Venezuela and other countries through golf. As the years passed, however, the importance and scope of this biennial Cup competition grew beyond Bolivian borders to include most all of the great golf playing countries around the world.

The Southern Golf Association, sponsor of the US team, accepted its initial invitation in 1983 and has seen the American flag raised last in the opening ceremony and lowered last in closing, a privilege issued to the defending champion and current champion respectively, six out of the eight times it has played in the tournament. Again, the entire US contingent was in awe of the hospitality of the Venezuelan Golf Federation and the high standards throughout the event. We of the Southern Golf Association salute all of the Venezuelan people and federation members involved in the operation of this great international golf tournament.

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF  
SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION  
(Approved 1975)**

I, the undersigned, a natural person of the age of twenty-one years or more, do hereby form a non-profit corporation under the laws of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Non-Profit Corporation Act", and the several amendments thereto, and to that end do hereby set forth:

**ARTICLE I  
NAME**

The name of the corporation is: SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION.

**ARTICLE II  
PERIOD OF DURATION**

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

**ARTICLE III  
PURPOSE**

The objects and purposes of the Association shall be to promote the game of golf, to protect the interest of its members, to hold such tournaments as may be decided upon by the Board of Directors, and to suitably recognize the winners in the Championship or other contests. The Association shall be empowered to engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of such exempt purposes specified in Section 501(c)(3).

**ARTICLE IV  
MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects and purposes of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. A regularly organized golf club is a club which is composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs and operate permanently at one golf course which they need not control. Upon the filing of these Articles of Incorporation, the initial membership shall consist of those clubs named on the Roster of Membership attached hereto.

**ARTICLE V  
DIRECTORS**

The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number, terms, qualifications and method of election of Directors shall be set forth in the bylaws.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be thirty-nine (39).

**REGISTERED OFFICE**

The address of the initial registered office of the Association is Suite 3500, ONE NCNB PLAZA, Charlotte, North Carolina 28280, and the address of the initial registered agent at such address is Richard E. Thigpen, Jr.

ARTICLE VII  
**NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION**

The Association is a non-profit organization, no part of the capital or net earnings of which shall inure to the benefit of any member or any private individual. Upon the dissolution of the Association, any assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations shall be distributed to the United States Golf Association provided it has retained its exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In the event the exempt status of the United States Golf Association has been revoked the assets of the Association shall be distributed to an organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which organization or organizations are not within the definition of a private foundation under Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code.

**BYLAWS  
OF  
SOUTHERN GOLF ASSOCIATION**

**ARTICLE I  
Membership**

**Section 1. Qualification for Membership.** Membership in the Association shall be open to any regularly organized golf club in the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia, whether or not incorporated, which endorses the objects of the Association and abides by its Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and such rules and regulations as may be established from time to time. As used herein, "any regularly organized golf club" means a permanent golf club composed of individual dues paying members who manage their own affairs through officers and committees whom they select. Such clubs shall operate permanently at one golf course which its members have the right to play but said club need not control the course where it plays.

**Section 2. Application for Membership.** Application for membership shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Association, in such form and accompanied by such information as the Secretary deems necessary for the Board of Directors to have before passing on such application. Dues for one (1) full year shall accompany the application.

**Section 3. Election to Membership.** Election to membership shall be by the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors present at any regular or special meeting at which such application is considered.

**Section 4. Suspension or Expulsion of Members.** Except as provided in Section 5, below, a member may be suspended or expelled from the Association with or without cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Board of Directors present in person.

**Section 5. Dues.** The Board of Directors shall fix the annual dues, which shall be payable prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Members of the club whose dues are not paid by that time shall be barred from entering all Association events during the period of delinquency.

**ARTICLE II  
Membership Meetings**

**Section 1. Annual Meeting.** The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held during the week and at the place of the annual Southern Championship Tournament, the exact day and hour to be fixed by the President of the Association. The Secretary of the Association shall give at least fourteen (14) days notice thereof to each member.

ARTICLE II (con't)

**Section 2. Special Meetings.** A special meeting of the Association may be held on call of the President or by written request directed to the Secretary and signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, provided that at least ten (10) days written notice thereof is given to each member. Such notice shall contain a statement of the purposes of the subject meeting.

**Section 3. Representation.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association, each member shall have the right to be represented, but in person only, by one voting delegate or alternate.

**Section 4. Quorum.** At any regular or special meeting of the Association those representative of members, present in person, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business that may come before the meeting.

ARTICLE III  
**Board of Directors**

**Section 1. General Powers and Duties.** The management of the affairs, property and policies of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Directors.

**Section 2. Number, Term, and Qualification.** The Board of Directors shall consist of the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President, a Vice President in charge of Junior Affairs and not less than twenty-five (25) nor more than forty-five (45) other directors. All directors will take office on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the year following election and will serve a term of one year, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. All members of the Board of Directors shall be members in good standing of a member club of the Association.

**Section 3. Election.** Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the member clubs by a vote of a majority of the voting delegates present in person. All vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by the remaining Directors, at any regular or special meeting, by the vote of the majority of the Directors in a meeting at which a quorum is present.

**Section 4. Meetings.** The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the Annual Meeting of the Association. In addition, special meetings may be called by or at the written request of the President or any three Directors. The person authorized by the Board to give notice of special meetings of the Board may designate the place, for the holding of any special meeting.

**Section 5. Notice.** Written notice of annual and special meetings of the Board shall be given to each Director at least ten (10) days in advance of said meeting. However, such notice may be waived as provided in these Bylaws. The business to be transacted at annual meetings need not be specified in the notice of such meetings, unless specifically required by law or by these Bylaws. Notice of a special meeting shall set forth the purpose for which the meeting is called.

**Section 6. Quorum.** Those Directors in attendance shall constitute quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. Unless otherwise required by charter or statute, the act of a majority of the Directors present at any properly convened meeting at which there is a quorum shall be deemed the act of the Board.

**Section 7. Directors Emeritus.** At any annual meeting, the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present in person, may elect Directors Emeritus to serve for life and those so elected shall have seat and voice on the Board of Directors but no vote.

ARTICLE III (con't):

**Section 8. Associate Directors.** The President shall have the authority to appoint Associate Directors for terms not to exceed one (1) year, and those so appointed shall have seat and voice but no vote.

**Section 9. Committees.** The Board of Directors may establish such standing or other committees as they consider proper or for the best interests of the Association and the membership of all such committees shall consist of those persons appointed by the President. The President of the Association shall ex-officio be a member of all committees.

**Section 10. Rules.** The Board of Directors shall make all rules governing the conduct and management of the Association which it deems advisable and which are not in conflict with the purpose of the Association or its Bylaws.

**Section 11. Compensation.** Directors shall receive no salary for their services.

ARTICLE IV  
**Waiver of Notice**

Whenever, under the laws of the State of North Carolina or by provision of these Bylaws, a waiver in writing is signed by persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, it shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

ARTICLE V  
**Officers**

**Section 1. Officers and Terms.** The officers of the Association shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Vice President for Junior Affairs, an Executive Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as may be elected by the Board of Directors. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be merged into the single office of Secretary-Treasurer at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office for one year, commencing on January 1<sup>st</sup> following election, or until his successor is elected and qualified.

**Section 2. Vacancies.** Vacancies in an office may be filled by the Directors at any regular or special meeting.

**Section 3. Election and Removal.** Any officer may be elected or removed without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors present in person at a regular or special meeting.

**Section 4. President.** The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board, shall be the chief executive officer of the Association, and shall have general supervision and management of the affairs of the Association subject, however, to the control, when exercised, of the Board of Directors. He shall make reports to the Directors and members and perform all such other duties as are incident to this office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors.

**Section 5. First Vice President.** The First Vice President shall perform all such duties as may be properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President and, in the absence or inability of the President, shall exercise and perform the functions and exercise all the powers of the President.

### ARTICLE V, Section 4 (con't):

**Section 6. Second Vice President.** The Second Vice President, in the absence of the First Vice President, shall perform the duties of that office.

**Section 7. Vice President for Junior Affairs.** The Vice President for Junior Affairs shall be responsible primarily for all functions of the Association sponsored for juniors.

**Section 8. Executive Secretary.** The Executive Secretary shall: keep minutes of the meetings of the Directors and members; have charge of the books and records; receive and disburse all funds; provide the Treasurer with accounts of all transactions concerning the financial condition of the Association; receive and process all membership applications and entries for tournaments; be responsible for making arrangements for tournaments and assisting in the conduct of competitions; perform such other duties as are incident to his office or are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President.

**Section 9. Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall have custody of all monies and securities of the Association and shall keep regular books of account. He shall disburse the funds of the Association as may be ordered by the Board of Directors or the President, and shall render an account of all his transactions as Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Association, and shall perform all duties incident to his office or that are properly required of him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sums and with such securities as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. He shall report in writing to the Board of Directors and the members of the Association at the meeting of each body.

**Section 10. Compensation.** The salaries, if any, of the employees and officers shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE VI

#### **Annual Championship Tournament and Other Tournaments**

**Section 1. Tournaments.** Each year a tournament for the Amateur Championship of the South shall be held under the direction and management of the Board of Directors, or such committees as they may designate, and suitable prizes shall be awarded in the championship. In addition, the Association shall conduct such other tournaments as the Board of Directors may determine from time to time. The Board shall determine the method of play in such tournaments or delegate such power or any part thereof to any duly established committee.

**Section 2. Site.** The Board shall select the sites for all tournaments sponsored by the Association. The site of the succeeding years' championship shall be determined at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

**Section 3. Entry Fees.** The entry fee for the championship tournament and all other tournaments shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The entries shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI, Section 1 (con't):

**Section 4. Eligibility.** No player shall be eligible to compete in a championship tournament unless: (1) he is a bona fide member of a club belonging to the Association and in good standing, and has been a member of the club from which he is entered for sixty (60) days prior to the date of the championship competition unless said competitor shall be otherwise eligible by reason of his membership in some other club; or (2) has competed within the calendar year of the tournament in which he is entered as a member of a golf team of a college or university located within one of the states named in Article 1, Section 1, which team represents said school in regularly scheduled intercollegiate golf competition; or (3) has received an invitation from a special committee of former Southern Golf Association Presidents who shall have the right, but not the obligation, to invite one or more competitors of national or international standing who are not otherwise eligible to compete in the Southern Golf Association Championship. Any person who is proved, to the satisfaction of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting to have been guilty of fraudulent act or other discreditable conduct of any kind, may be declared by the Board of Directors to be ineligible to compete in any competition, suspended or expelled.

ARTICLE VII  
**Rules of Tournaments**

All tournament competition shall be played strictly in accordance with the rules of golf approved by the United States Golf Association with such local rules as the Rules Committee of this Association may adopt or authorize. All other disputes shall be decided by the Tournament Committee, whose decision shall be final.

ARTICLE VIII  
**Disputes Between Member Clubs**

All complaints and disputes between member clubs of this Association shall be decided by the Board of Directors, excluding representatives of any member club involved in the dispute being considered.

ARTICLE IX  
**Amendments**

The Board of Directors shall have the power to make, amend and repeal the Bylaws of this Association by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Directors present at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Such action of the Board shall be subject to review by the members of the Association.

**RESOLUTION**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Southern Golf Association does hereby endorse the development of a people-to-people relationship at the international level through the promotion of the game of golf and international, amateur competition to the end that international goodwill and understanding might be strengthened; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the officers of the Southern Golf Association are hereby authorized and directed to implement those programs deemed reasonable to achieve the objectives of this Association.
